CATTLE — Receipts 16,500 compared with 21,800 last week and 21,500 a year ago Twelve market receipts 158,600 compared with 175,400 last week and 144,600 a year ago

Compared with last Friday, slaughter steers sold 25-100 higher with most of the advance on Prime. Slaughter heifers mostly 50 higher while cows sold steady to 50 higher and bulls closed steady after losing earlier upturn in the carlot dressed meat trade. Steer beef was steady to 50 higher and heifer beef sold 25-50 higher while cow beef was steady to 50 lower

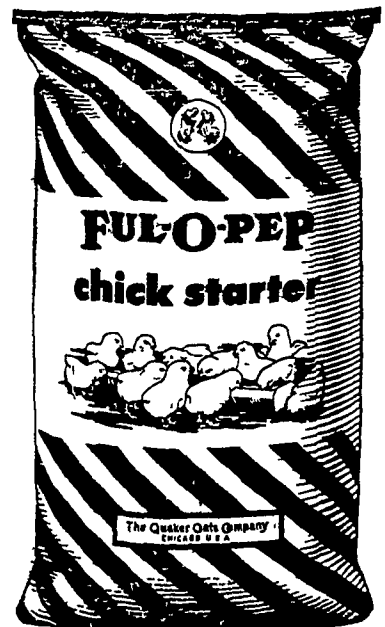
