Prices unchanged on light hens. Demand good. Offerings increasing as Easter weekend approaches & egg producers are more anxious to schedule the movement of birds. However, offerings overall remain barely adequate. Some bids at 11-11½c in Pa section were declined. Supplies & offerings ample on heavy hens for the light buying interest. Occasional flock negotiated at 20c. Limited open market transactions on 7# cockerels were priced at 30c. Inquiry fair, supplies short of full requirements. Prices paid at farms: Light Hens 10-11½, mostly 10½-11¼c

WEEKLY SUMMARY

Broiler and fryer live prices averaged 16.46 cents per lb. on the Eastern Shore Exchange this week, a drop of ¼ cent from last week, and the second week of substantial price decline.

Prices paid during the week ranged from a high of 17.3 cents on Monday to a low of 15.2 cents on Wednesday.

Sales for the week totaled 1.5 million head, about the same as for the preceding week.

Delmarva

April 8, 1966

The Delmarva broiler and fryer lot average price declined slightly from 16.38 to 16.31 cents per lb. Demand was good for heavy auction offerings. Live supplies continued adequate for needs.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 868,000 head, compared to 791,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday broilers and fryers at farm prices ranged 15.4-17.0 cents per lb on reported purchases of 994,100 head.

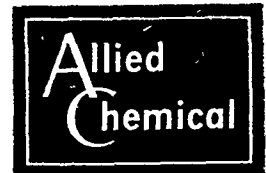

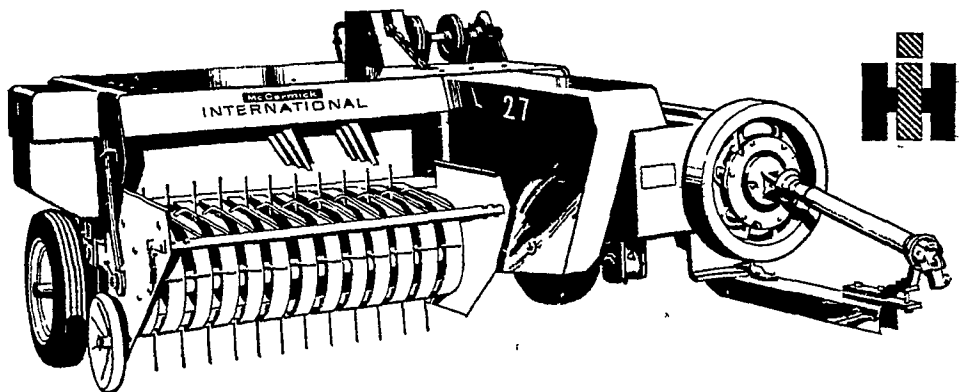
