 Unchanged to 1/4c on light hens. Offered despite post Easter period. Demand good. Sales on heavy hens spot prices. Offerings adequate for the current light inquiry. Prices at farms: Light hens 11 1/4c, mostly 10 1/2-11c; Hens, too few to re-

clined slightly today from 15.02 to 14.06 cents per lb. Demand fair for heavy auction offerings. Supplies ample for needs with weights remaining heavier than desired in many cases.

Estimated slaughter for today and Saturday, 874,000 head, compared to 868,000 head last weekend.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Friday, broiler and fryer at farm reported prices ranged 14.1 to 15.7 cents per lb. on sales of 1,101,800 head.

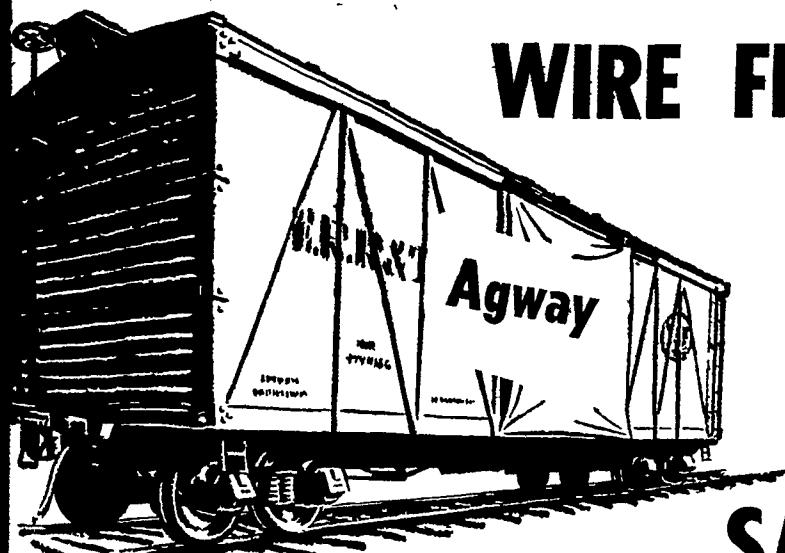

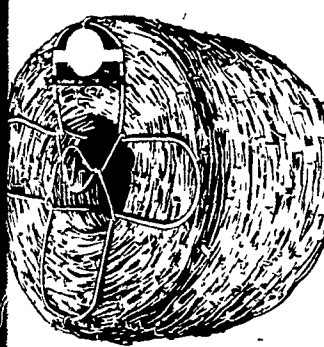

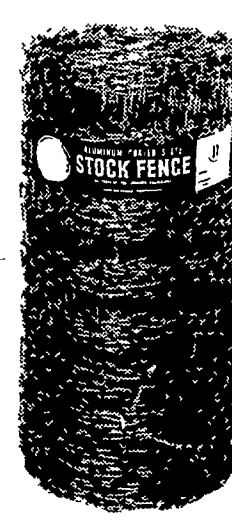
