New Poultry Recipe Book Is Available

Facts, recipes, and helpful hints for buying, storing, cooking, and serving poultry meat are outlined in a new booklet issued by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

"Poultry in Family Meals: A Guide for Consumers" has up-to-date information for homemakers who wish to serve chicken, turkey, duck, or goose in a main dish, salad, sandwich, or snack. The 32-page booklet was prepared by food specialists of the Agricultural Research Service.

The guide offers practical tips on buying poultry meats, whether fresh, frozen, canned or pre-processed. It recommends that food shoppers not overlook poultry, since this meat suits most appetites and provides an excellent source of high-quality protein plus other essentials as iron, thiamine, riboflavin, and niacin.

Methods described for cooking poultry include easy-to-follow directions for roasting, broiling, frying, rotisserie cooking, barbecuing, simmering, braising, and pressure cooking — plus notes on how to cook giblets and make gravy. New information based on recent research suggests shorter cooking times for turkey. For example, roasting recommended for a 16-to-20-pound turkey used to be 6 to 7½ hours, this was reduced to 5½ to 6½ hours to prevent the meat from drying out too much.

The program will be supervised by the cooperative extension service on behalf of the 146,000 young equestrians already participating in the 4-H program from coast-to-coast.

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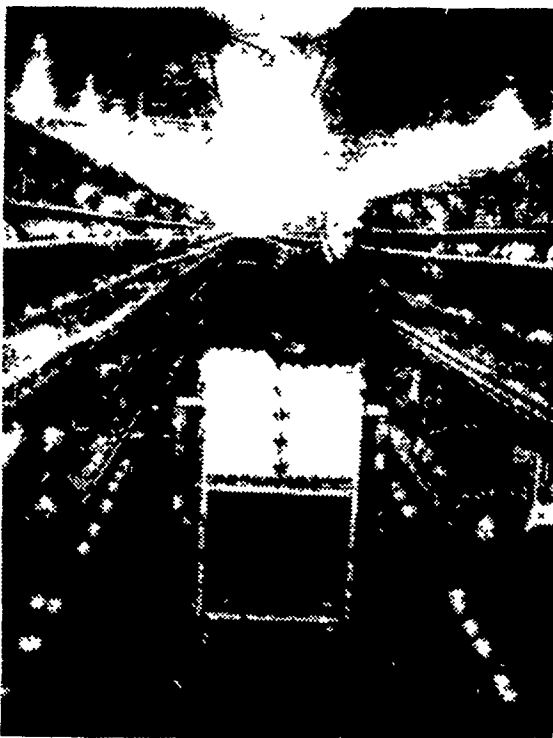
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
