For You To Try, Broiled Grapefruit

Sprinkle each grapefruit half with sugar and a dash of cinnamon, mace, or nutmeg. Dot with bits of butter or margarine, put the halves in the broiler pan and set on the rack three to four inches from the heat. When the grapefruit is slightly browned and heated through, remove from the broiler and serve at once.

When You Use Any Aerosol Spray

Never spray near fire or flame. Never smoke while spraying. Never store container where temperature may go higher than 120 degrees. Never throw an aerosol spray can in the fire, or keep on the range or radiator. Never puncture a can — this could also cause it to burst.

Some General Rules For Cake Baking

High quality ingredients will yield the best quality product. Use fresh eggs, milk and shortening.

Have ingredients at room temperature. Take eggs from the refrigerator long enough before beginning the cake so they have a chance to warm up.

Follow the recipe directions exactly and measure accurately. Do not increase, decrease, or substitute basic ingredients, thinking you can improve the recipe. A cake recipe is a carefully balanced formula, scientifically designed and tested to give the best results.

Use the size pans specified in a recipe.

Always preheat oven unless the recipe directs doing otherwise.

Place cake pan as near to the center of the oven as possible and away from the oven sides.

These rules apply, whether making shortening-type cakes leavened with baking powder and/or soda, shortening-type cakes leavened with air, or nonshortening cakes leavened with air.
