

Charolais Breed Is Eligible For Livestock Exp.

Charolais will be an added breed of beef cattle, making a total of five, at the 10th Pennsylvania Livestock Exposition, Nov 7-11 in the State Farm Show Building, according to Harold R. McCulloch, manager.

Other beef breeds in the show will be Angus, Hereford, Polled Hereford and Shorthorn. McCulloch said inclusion of Charolais in the competitive classes may make the beef division the largest in the exposition's history.

Admission of the new beef breed was on application of the American International

Charolais Association through J. Scott Henderson, executive secretary.

Henderson indicated entries may total 100 head. They will include bulls and females in breeding classes and steers. The association will pay one-half of an estimated \$2,600 in premiums. In addition, it is offering \$250 to grand championship winners in both the junior and open classes provided they show Charolais.

This will be the second appearance of Charolais in the show. Ten head, most of them from Texas, comprised a special non-competitive display in 1962.

Ben Morgan, general chairman, said the breed, meanwhile, has expanded rapidly and that a number of herds have been established in Penn-

sylvania and other eastern states.

A multi-purpose animal, the Charolais is used for both milk and meat production. It originated in France where it formerly was used also as a beast of burden.

They are off-white in color, of large frame, and attain unusual weights. Bulls range up to nearly 3,000 pounds.

They are used extensively in cross breeding, and transmit to offspring, Morgan explained, a hybrid vigor that enables the young to make rapid gains in weight.

Frey Cow Sets Pa. Milk Record

A registered Holstein in the herd of J. Mowery Frey & Son, Lancaster, has set a new butterfat production record for Pennsylvania, according to the Holstein-Friesian Association of America.

Breaking the previous all-time record is Fultonway Ivanhoe Rae 4977152 (VG) with her new record for Mature Holsteins milked twice daily in the 305-day division of the HIR program. Her official 305-day lactation totaled 27,171 lbs of milk and 1,221 lbs of butterfat.

Fultonway Ivanhoe Rae was bred in the Frey herd. She was sired by Osbornale Ivanhoe 1189870 (EX) a bull that has earned a Gold Medal Sire recognition.

Yoder Reelected NEBA President

Ira L. Yoder of Selinsgrove was reelected president of NEBA (Northeastern Breeders, Assn.) at the board's reorganization meeting recently. The breeding cooperative, with headquarters at Tunkhannock, provides artificial insemination service for dairy and beef cattle in Pennsylvania and New Jersey. Repeating for another term as vice-president is Wilmer Hill of Slatington. Newly elected treasurer was Albert Wells, Hallstead. These three officers and director Edward Flitcraft of Woodstown, N. J., make up the 4-man executive committee which also functions as finance committee. Operations Mgr Wm Schaefer, Jr of Tunkhannock was elected secretary of the board. Elected to three-year terms as directors were John Schwenk, Allentown; George Butler, Wellsboro; and Edward Flitcraft.

Judy Buckwalter, the program will feature a debate on the method by which club steers will be obtained in the future. All members, and their parents, are urged to attend.

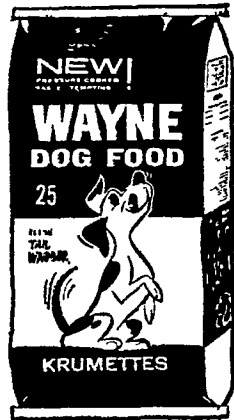
County Holstein Repeats 1/2-Ton Performance

Another official production record exceeding a half ton of butterfat has been completed by Pleasant Grove Lucinda Dean, a registered Holstein, cow owned by Charles C. Tindall, Peach Bottom. This is the second time that she has achieved the 1,000 lb. butterfat production level in a single lactation. Her record ranks among 2,018 similarly completed by registered Holstein cows on official test.

This Pennsylvania Holstein's official record of production totaled 23,222 lbs. of milk and 1,049 lbs of butterfat in 365 days. She started her lactation at the age of 8 years and 1 month and was milked two times daily.

Pleasant Grove Lucinda Dean was bred in the Tindall herd. She was sired by Maplebend Dean King Posch 10994-77 (VG), a bull that has earned a Gold Medal Sire recognition.

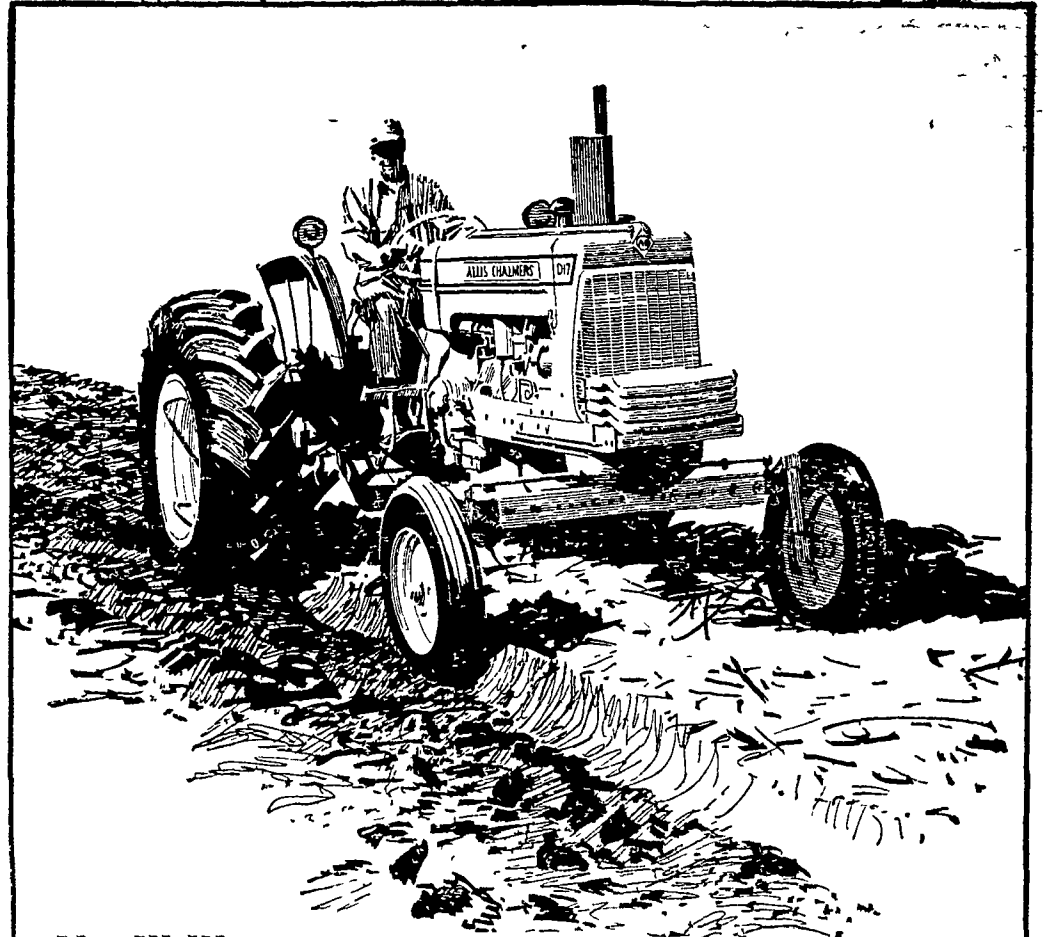
