### New Committee Opposes Federal Hide Export Cut

Formation of a Committee on Hides to work with industry groups and governmental agencies on problems regarding the production and distribution of cattle hides, calf and kid skins and bovine leathers was announced recently by Herrell DeGraff, American Meat Institute president.

The Committee is headed by Dean M. Clute, of Swift & Company, Chicago.

At its initial meeting, the Committee reiterated industry opposition to federal restrictions on hide exports, pointing out that current quotas on exports have cut back hide prices equivalent to \$3 per head for 1,200 pound native steers.

The U. S. Department of Commerce has under advisement requests from livestock and meat organizations asking that the export restrictions be withdrawn

use, Fred G. Seldomridge, chairman, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Committee, pointed out this week. Any other city or county government — or the state — could likewise qualify, Seldomridge reported.

Greenspan — so called because of its potential for making green space available to urban residents — is a new way to take cropland out of agricultural production and convert it to open space, public recreation, wildlife habitat, natural beauty, or uses that control air or water pollution.

It is a part of the new Cropland Adjustment Program, authorized by legislation enacted by the Congress last year, under which farmers shift acres out of certain crops while retaining title to the land. Communities buying cropland may receive financial help under the program similar to that farmers receive under long-term CAP agreements.

Under Greenspan, the Secretary of Agriculture may transfer funds to any state or local government in the amount figured at the same rate as would have been used had the land remained in the hands of the farmer, and not exceeding 50 percent of the cost of the land. Since conservation is an important goal of Greenspan, assistance is also available to help install needed conservation practices on such land in much the same way as the cost-sharing available on private farm lands.

Projects for which Greenspan may provide financial assistance include parks, playgrounds, camping or picnic areas, public hunting or fishing, protection of a scenic area, a "green belt" to control sprawl or protect zoning, or reservoir pollution control.

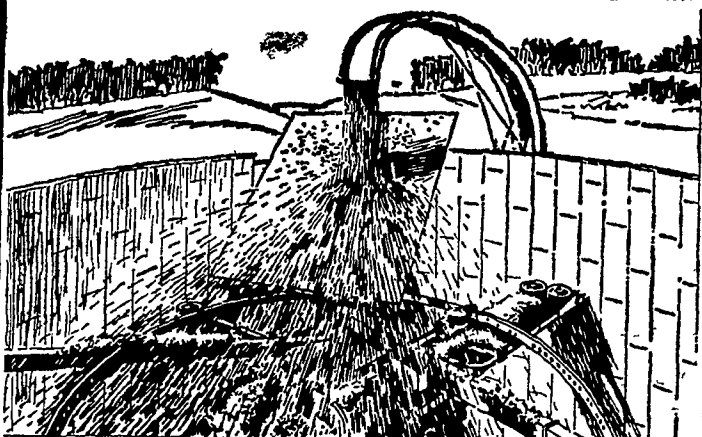

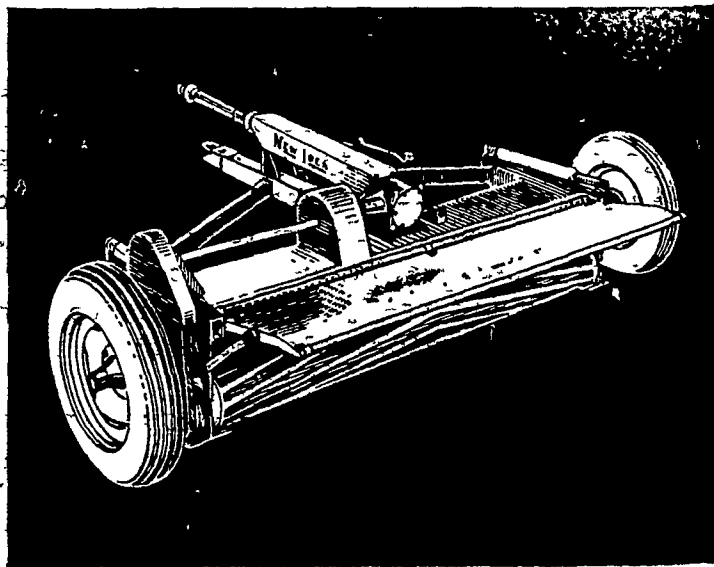
