

## Deadline For Area Dairy Princess Contest Entries Set For June 1st

The clock in the steeple says it is May 21st. That means the deadline for "princesses" is fast approaching, since June 1 will be the last opportunity for a farm girl to enter the Area Dairy Princess Contest for the 1966 title.

In announcing the deadline for entries, Mrs. Herbert M. Royer of 2025 Oregon Pike, Lancaster, urged that eligible girls do not pass up this opportunity to compete in the contest. Two girls have already entered, she said. Mrs. Royer will serve as chaperone for the new princess, as she has for 1965 Dairy Princess Linda Lou Welk. Mrs. Royer has also been selected to chaperone the 1966 Pennsylvania Dairy Princess who will be chosen July 20 and 21 at York, and she will go to the national contest in Chicago the week of June 21st, where the 1965 Pennsylvania Princess will compete.

To be eligible for the county contest (county and area are the same since Lancaster County is an individual milk-marketing area) a girl must be a daughter of a county dairy farmer producing milk commercially, be at least 17 years of age, and not reach age 25 before June 30, 1966, be a high school graduate before June 30, 1966, be single and a Pennsylvania resident.

The contest is divided into two parts. Area princesses will be chosen in June in each of the 12 milk marketing areas in the state. On July 20 and 21, in Hotel Yorktowne, York, the 12 area princesses will compete for the title of Pennsylvania Dairy Princess for 1966.

Both area and state winners will receive a variety of prizes. The finalists also have an opportunity to represent the dairy industry throughout the year in public appearances at banquets, county fairs and civic events.

### AREA PRINCESS PAGEANT

The area Dairy Princess Pageant will be held this year at the Host Motel, Lancaster, at 7 p.m. on June 30. Harry Kauffman of the Philadelphia Dairy Council will again serve as master of ceremonies, and Mrs. Royer reports that those

The highlight of the pageant will, of course, be the selection of the Princess who will represent Lancaster County in the coming year. She will be chosen by a group of three judges whose names have not yet been announced. Immediately preceding the crowning

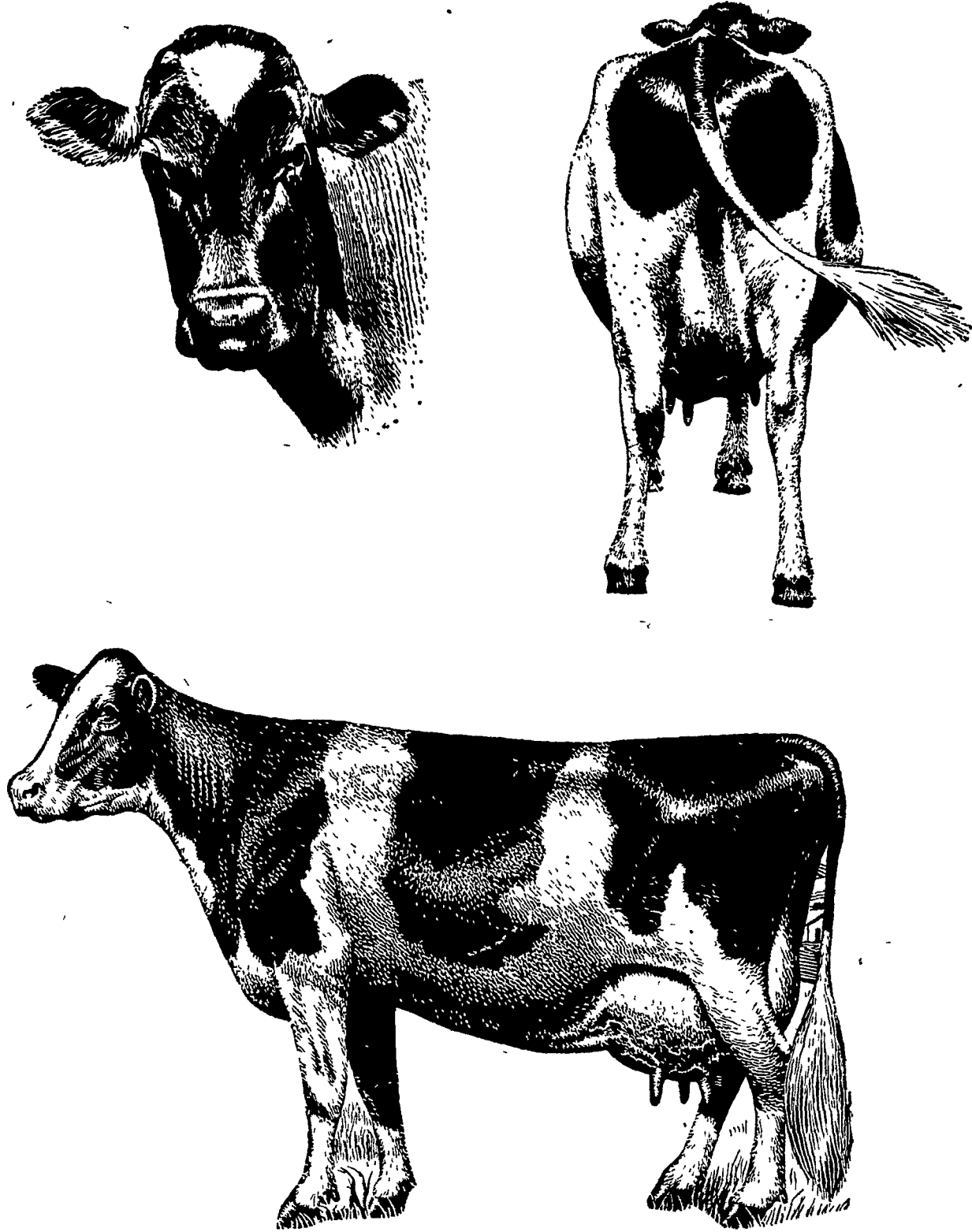
of the Princess, winners of the special cooking contest will be announced, Mrs. Royer said.
