

There are some very important papers which should be stored in a safe deposit box. Stocks, bonds, certificates, and negotiable securities need safekeeping. Property records, such as deeds, mortgages, and loans, and service records should also be included. Insurance policies, birth and marriage certificates, and automobile titles should be safely filed. It's also a good idea to include a signed copy of your will.
