Penn State in the fall to study agriculture and dairy science. The two girls, Mary Ellen and Carol Jean, are 15 and 11 years old, respectively, and are also veteran 4-H showmen. The youngest Kettering, Bennie, is nine and is a first year member of the county 4-H dairy club. There are several effective labor-saving devices in operation at Kettering's. The pipeline milker and bulk milk tank combination speeds the milking operation considerably. In addition, Kettering has a hay-drying system which he said has worked out very well. Bales are put into the mow and dried right in place. The dryer, operated by fuel oil, will handle about 1000 bales at a time. He has found his best results by partly drying the hay with heat, and then finishing with just the fan.

that spraying the alfalfa stubble will give him a little better weevil control for later cuttings.

Many of the home-bred cows at Kettering's are turning in some excellent records. For example, five year-old Henket Daisy Ivanhoe had 19,274 pounds of milk and 854 pounds of fat in her last 305 day lactation. Another five year-old, Henket Eva Ivanhoe, had 853 pounds of fat and 15,805 pounds of milk in 305 days. Another, Henket Stella Princess, a six year-old, produced 20,585 pounds of milk and 745 of fat in 305 days.

An announcement which just came through from the Holstein-Friesian Association of America stated that the Henry E Kettering herd has 59 completed production records averaging 16,291 pounds of milk and 636 pounds of fat on a 305-day, mature equivalent basis.

Ladybugs Fail To Control Weevils

In the constant battle to control alfalfa weevils, Kettering tried seven gallons of ladybugs on his 60 acres of alfalfa this year. These were put on the fields in the first week of May, but masses of weevils appearing on the crushing roller, after making a first cutting on the alfalfa last week, suggests that the ladybugs are fighting a losing battle. 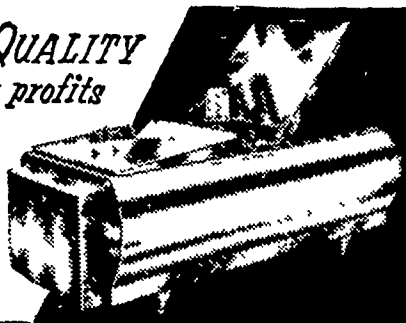
