LIVE HENS

Prices on light hens unchanged to 1/4c lower. Offerings barely adequate for the less aggressive but fair demand. Movement declined in several instances in Penna. section. Demand only fair on heavy hens. Offerings light & closely held with bids @ 19c declined by some producers. Few 5-6 1/2 # fowl were moved @ 12 1/2c. Prices paid at farms: Light hens 10-11, mostly 10 1/2-11c; Heavy hens 19c.

Eastern Shore Exchange WEEKLY SUMMARY

Lot average broiler and fryer prices on the Eastern Shore Exchange declined nearly 1/2-

cent this week to a level of 15.63 cents per lb.

Prices paid ranged from a high of 17.2 cents on Monday, and again on Tuesday, to a low of 14.1 cents per lb. on Thursday.

Sales for the week totaled 1,449,600 head, up slightly over last week's total.

Delmarva broiler and fryer lot average prices declined 1/4-cent to a level of 15.50 cents per lb. Demand fair for moderate auction offerings with sizes and quality uniform.

Ready-to-cook demand remains exceptionally good with all plants running at capacity. Delivered prices generally unsettled and competitive with other producing areas.

Estimated slaughter for today, 839,000 head compared to 891,300 head last Thursday.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Thursday, broilers and fryers at farm prices ranged 14 1/2-16 0, with sales reported at 984,000 head.

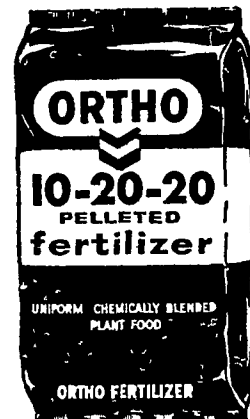
