### Weekly Review

**CATTLE** — Receipts 20,400 compared with 23,800 last week and 28,400 a year ago. Twelve market receipts 161,800 compared with 173,700 the previous week and 187,900 a year ago. Compared with last weeks close, slaughter steers sold steady to 25 lower, with the decline on High Choice and Prime. Slaughter heifers were generally steady. Cows and bulls closed the period steady. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer and heifer beef was steady to weak, and cow-beef was steady to 1.00 lower, with most decline on Commercial and breaking Utility.

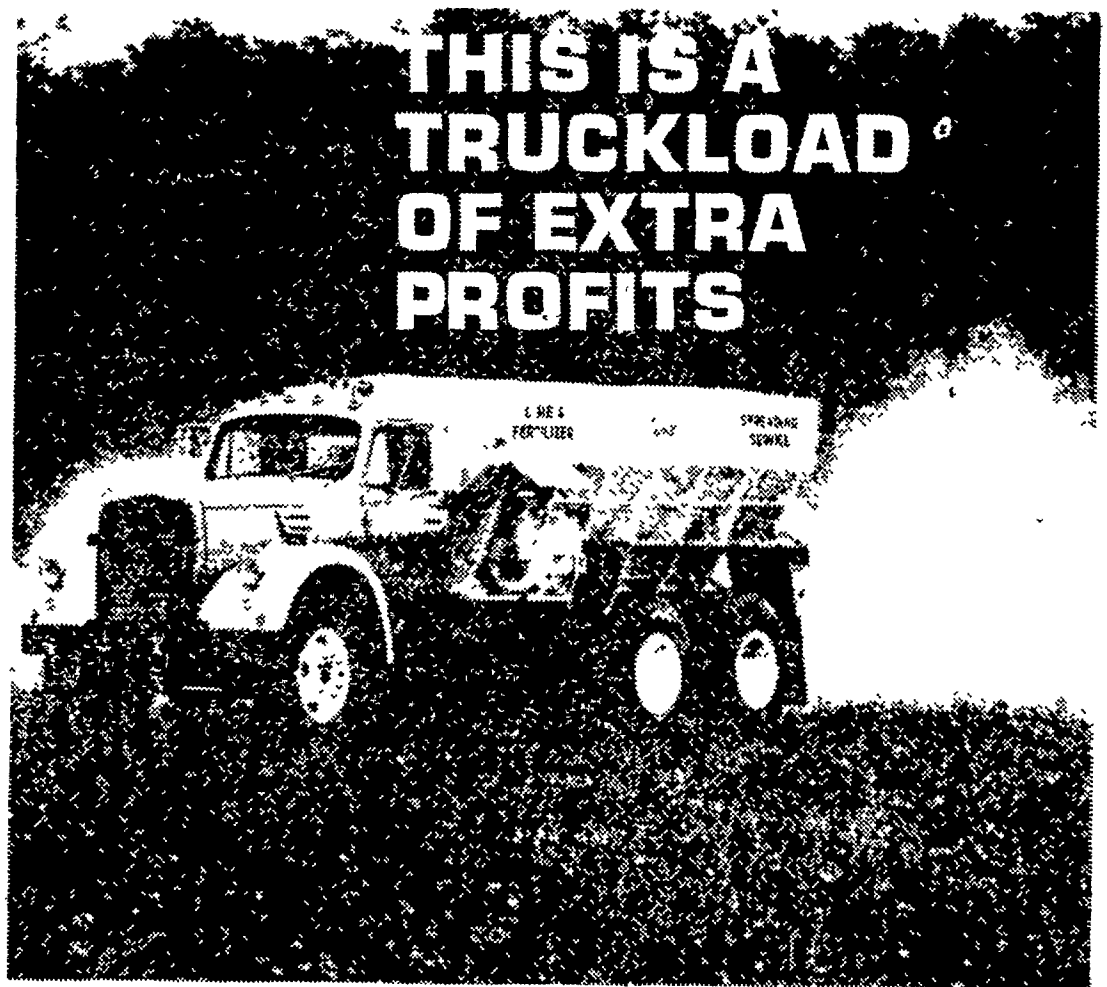
