

### Chick Hatch Rate Up 2% First Five Months

Production of flock replacement chicks in Pennsylvania totaled 3,757,000 during May, 10 percent more than for the same month in 1965, according to the State Crop Reporting Service. The hatch pushed the 1966 five-month cumulative egg-type production to 15,412,000, a 6 percent gain over the January-May hatch of 1965.

Broiler chick production last month showed a 9 percent gain over May 1965 for a total

of 5,440,000. The cumulative January-May total of 23,219,000 was about the same as for the comparable period a year ago. Total broiler and replacement hatch for May was two percent more than the 1960-64 average for the month. The January-May cumulative total of 38,631,000 also indicated a two percent increase over the similar period in 1965.

Federal income tax is due on income in excess of \$600 per year. However, income tax is usually withheld by employers starting with the first paycheck. If less than \$600 income is received by the youth during the year, the money which was withheld will be returned when he files a tax return. Of course, if he earns more than \$600, he is required to file a return.

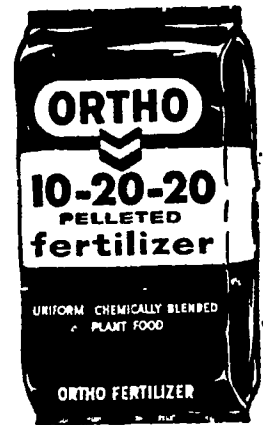
