WEEKLY SUMMARY**

LIVE HENS

Prices fractionally lower on light hens. Limited supplies adequate to barely sufficient for fair buying interest. Some arrivals, especially those from outside the area, showed a heavier loss in mortality because of extreme high temperatures. Supplies of heavy hens fully ample for a fair demand. Prices paid at farm, light hens 9-10¼, mostly 9½-10¼; Heavy Hens too few sales to report.

WEEKLY SUMMARY

Lot-average broiler and fryer prices this week averaged ½-cent higher than last week, to a level of 15 31 cents per lb.

Prices paid during the week hit both their high and low points on Monday with a range of 14 5-16 5 cents per lb.

Sales for the week totaled 15 million head, an increase of about ¼-million head over the preceding week.

July 14, 1966

Broiler and fryer lot average prices declined slightly with good demand, although lighter than earlier in the week. Live supplies were ample, but processors were curtailing purchases in some instances due to lighter ready-to-cook demand.

Heat continued to take its toll of live birds with weights lighter than desired, especially sizes 3½ lbs and up.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Thursday, prices reported paid at farms for broilers and fryers ranged 14 9-15 8 cents per lb on total sales of 1.1 million head.

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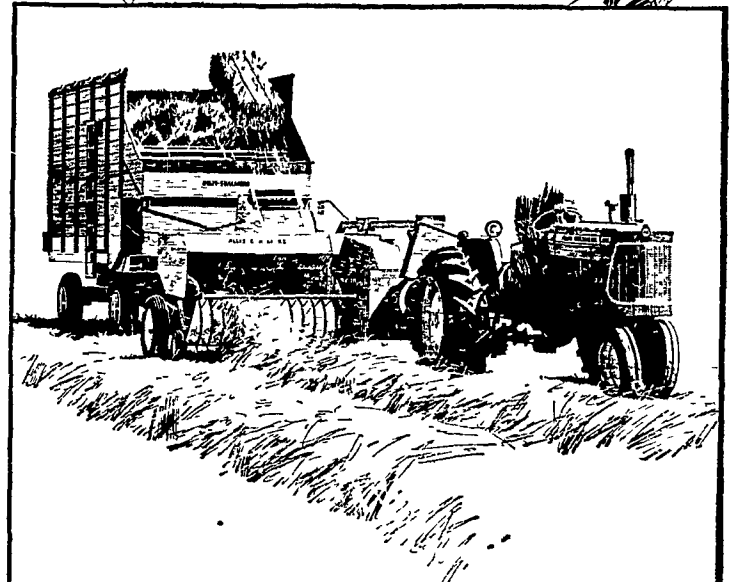


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
