LIVE HENS

Light hens held unchanged pricewise. Supplies very limited in New Jersey but about adequate in Eastern Penna. Prices towards the lower part of the range represent purchases of smaller quantities while high prices reflect value of larger lots. Prices on heavy hens unchanged to fractionally lower. Trading limited and supplies ample. Prices paid @ farm light hens 9-10½, mostly 10-10¼c; Heavy 14¼-15½, mostly 15-15½c.

18.0 cents per lb. on Wednesday. Sales for the week lost the ¼-million-head gain of last week to total 1.3 million head.

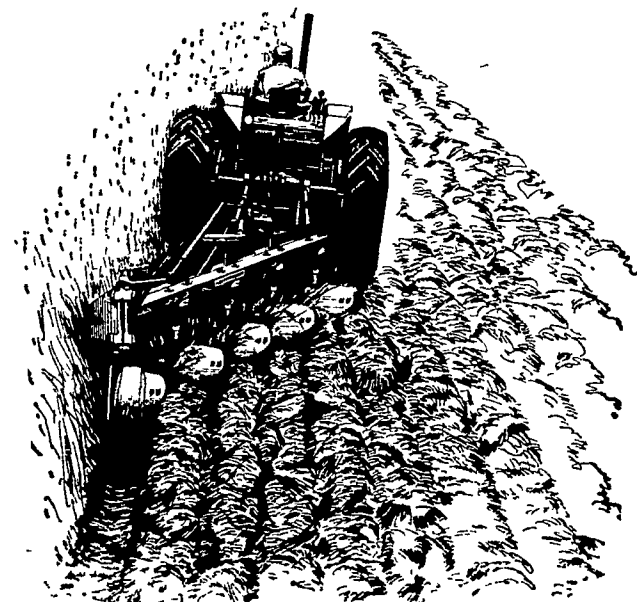
