Accompanying the boys is an honorary FFA chapter member, Kenneth Umbenhauer, an E'Town Junior High School social studies teacher.

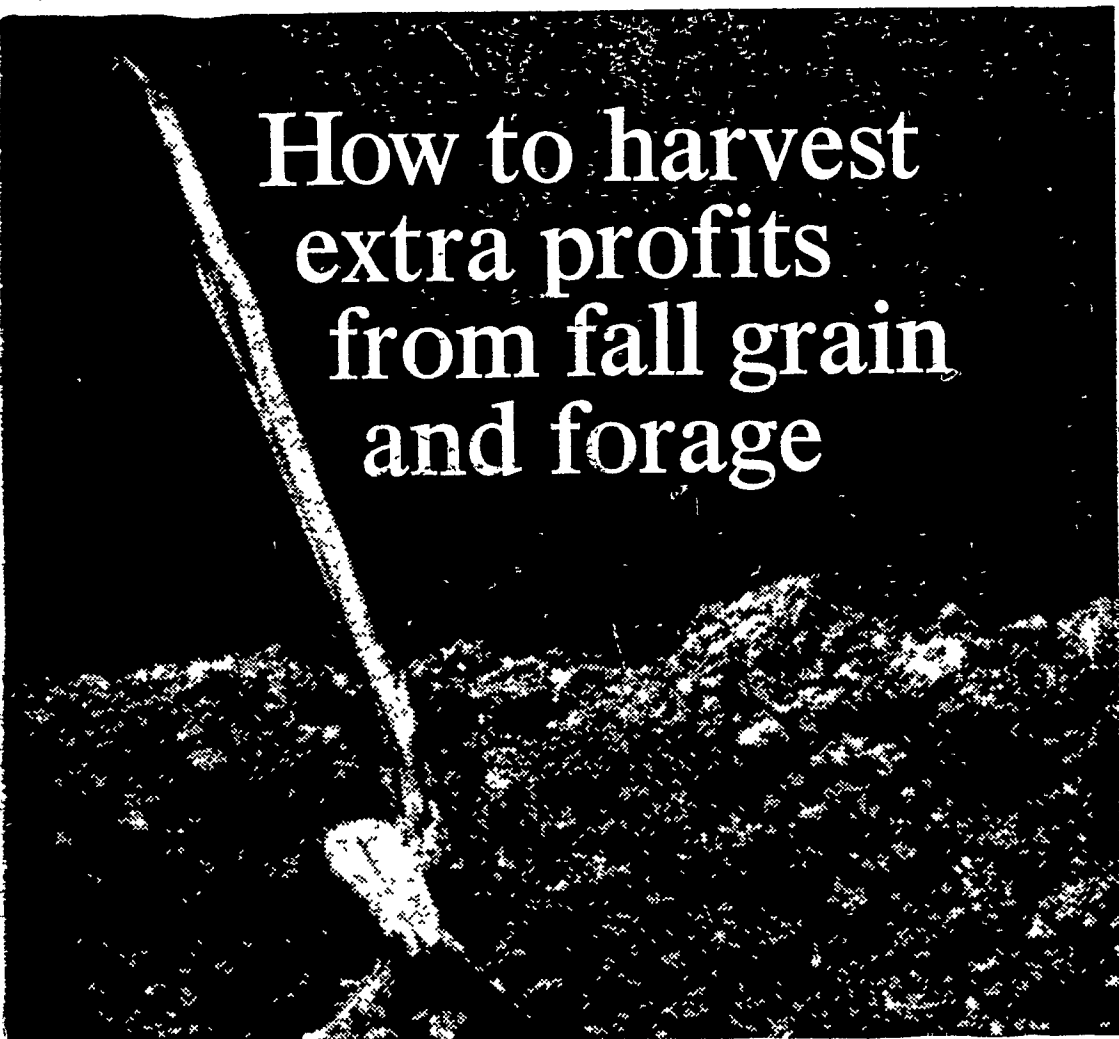
This will be the third group from the E'Town Chapter to make this trek west. The purpose of the trip is to reward the boys who have contributed to the chapter FFA project.

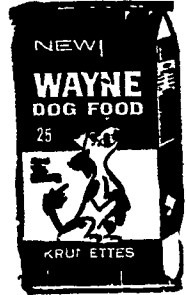
