milk. Stir into dry ingredients. Mix until all ingredients are moistened; let stand 5 minutes. Reserve 2/3 cup crust mixture for top. Evenly spread remaining mixture over bottom and up sides of a greased shallow 2-quart (11 1/4 x 7 1/2 x 1 3/4 inch) baking dish, bringing crust up onto edge of dish. Spoon hot filling into crust; top with spoonfuls of reserved crust mixture. Bake in a preheated moderate oven (350 degrees) 30 to 35 minutes. Makes 8 servings.

ALFRESCO MEAT "LOAF"

- 1 cup cracker meal
- 1 (1 1/2 ounce) envelope onion soup mix
- 3/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 2 pounds ground beef

- 2 eggs, beaten
- 1/2 cup chili sauce
- 1/4 cup water

Combine cracker meal, soup mix and pepper in a large mixing bowl. Add remaining ingredients; mix lightly. Gently shape mixture into a rectangular patty; place in hand rack on grill. Broil over hot coals 10 to 12 minutes on each side or until cooked as desired. Makes 8 servings.

Ladies, Have You Heard? . . .

Spot And Stain Removal From Washable Fabrics

- To remove fruit and berry stains . . . If safe for fabric, pour boiling water from height of 1 to 3 feet through stain. Wash with synthetic detergent and rinse. Bleach if stain remains, but test fabric first for colorfastness.
- To remove grass stains . . . Rinse with cold water and rub in synthetic detergent. Wash. Bleach last traces of stain with hydrogen peroxide. If rubbing alcohol doesn't affect fabric and color, it may be used to remove a grass stain.
- To remove grease and tar stains . . . Remove excess grease with dull knife.



THOMAS

Sponge with carbon tetrachloride to treat stain as such. Wash with synthetic detergent and rinse well.

To remove milk, cream, or ice cream stains . . .

Soak in cold water. If ice cream is fruit or chocolate,
