 will be held by mail ballot which will be sent to all farmers on record in the County ASCS office. To be counted, ballots must be returned to the county office no later than August 31.

Each of the county's 16 communities will choose three committeemen and two alternates.

Last year, ASCS reported, 14,000 acres of farmland were improved under the Agricultural Conservation Program which it administers locally. The total investment in conservation was \$225,000 with about half coming from the participating farmer and the balance from ACP.
