stricken crops which have re-

ceived heavy nitrogen fertilization.

Smith advises that the danger period will be greatly diminished after Monday, and re-emphasized the importance of not grazing or green chopping forage until after that time.

However, he added, a farmer could make hay or silage from these crops now for feeding later without great danger. "Just don't feed them green for awhile," he said.
