

June DHIA Led By Wolf Cow & Red Rose Herd

A registered Holstein owned by Lloyd Wolf, Quarryville R2, completed the highest 305-day lactation in the Red Rose Dairy Herd Improvement Association in June. She produced 18,760 pounds of milk and 829 pounds of butterfat.

High butterfat herd for the month was owned by the Red Rose Research Center, 226 Pitney Rd., Lancaster, averaging 64 pounds of fat and 1742 pounds of milk for the 28 cows tested.

Second high lactation was completed by a Holstein cow owned by John M. King of

Ronks R1. She produced 17,048 pounds of milk and 787 of fat. The herd of Paul H. Herr, Holtwood R1, placed second high for the month with his 11 registered and grade Jerseys averaging 1095 pounds of milk and 60 pounds of fat


