

Dunlap & Sons, Inc., Lancaster, at 35 cents a pound Both of these figures were considerably stronger than last year's prices paid for grand and reserve champion 4-H pigs, which were 43 and 27 cents, respectively. This year's average sale price on the 146 head offered was also slightly higher at \$27.27 per hundredweight, compared to last year's \$26.08 average. Pigs this year at 215 pounds averaged six pounds heavier than last year's entries. The sale is annually sponsored by the Lancaster Livestock Exchange.

In the junior and senior showmanship classes, winners were Donald Bollinger, Denver R2, and Thomas Lefever. Quarryville R1, respectively. This was the second consecutive year's win in that division for Bollinger. Reserve showman ribbons went to Marlin Bollinger, Denver R2, junior;
