Demand fair. Offerings barely adequate. Some growers holding 23-25 lb. toms for heavier weights before moving birds. Few lots of heavy hens sold @ 23 1/2c & toms over 25 lbs. at 23-24c.

During the week prices ranged from a high of 17.9 to a low of 16.1 cents per lb. Total sales held steady with last week at 1.66-million head.

September 1, 1966

Broiler-fryer lot-average prices declined 1/2 cent today to a level of 16.89 cents per lb. Demand rather poor for moderate auction offerings. Live supplies remain adequate for needs.

Ready-to-cook demand on current deliveries has improved to a generally good position. Estimated slaughter for today, 916,000 head, compared

to 872,000 last Thursday.

In the 24 hours preceding market close on Thursday prices paid at farms for broilers and fryers ranged 16.2 to 17.5 cents per lb. on reported purchases of one million head.
