Ballots For Lamb and Wool Referendum Sent

Ballots for voting in the referendum on lamb and wool promotion and marketing development program were mailed Friday to 238 eligible farmers in Lancaster County, according to ASCS chairman Fred Seldomridge. Ballots are to be returned to the county ASCS office by September 23, he added.

The referendum will determine whether or not deductions will continue to be made from producer payments under the National Wool Program.

If approved, the new agreement will replace the one which has been in effect since the 1955-crop year. If not approved, no deduction will be withheld from payments on 1966 marketings, and ASPC programs will be continued only as long as present reserve funds permit

Approval of the new agreement would authorize payment deductions of up to 1½ cents per pound on shorn wool, and up to 712 cents on unshoin lambs The new figures compate with 1 cent and 5 cents in the past

Producers eligible to vote are those who have owned sheep of lambs six months of age or older for at least 30 consecutive days since January 1, 1966 Any producer not receiving a ballot, and wishing to vote, is instructed to contact the ASCS office, Manheim Pike, Lancaster

All species of farm animals may suffer from internal parasite infection, years ago we were more concerned with the contiol of worms in hogs and sheep However, at the present time cattle feeders and darrymen should also take measures to eliminate stomach worms Many lots of feeder cattle imported into the county are infected, and treatment at the beginning of the feeding period will pay big dividends Youi local veterinarian should be consulted regarding this important management problem Don't feed the worms



Temperatures for the next five days are expected to average above the normal range of 79 to 58 degrees. Little day-to-day change in temperatures will occur, but the warmest part of the period will be about mid-week.

No real rain is in the forecast but some light precipitation in the form of scattered showers may yield 1/10 inch late Saturday or Sunday.






