LIVE HENS

Hen prices mostly unchanged. Undertone weaker as processors tend to reduce prices for shipments after this week. Demand fair. Offerings adequate. Supplies on heavy hens barely adequate for a fair to good demand. Prices paid at farm: Light hens: 9-10c; Heavy hens 14-14½c.

TURKEYS

Demand good on hens as some Kasher buying activity developed. Interest on toms fair. Supplies adequate. Prices on heavy hens ranged 23-25c with fancy quality mostly 24-25c. Toms under 25#, 22½c; over 26#, 23c.

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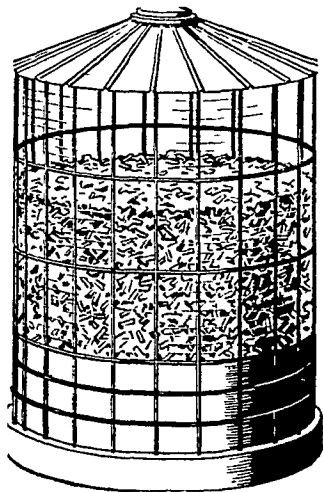
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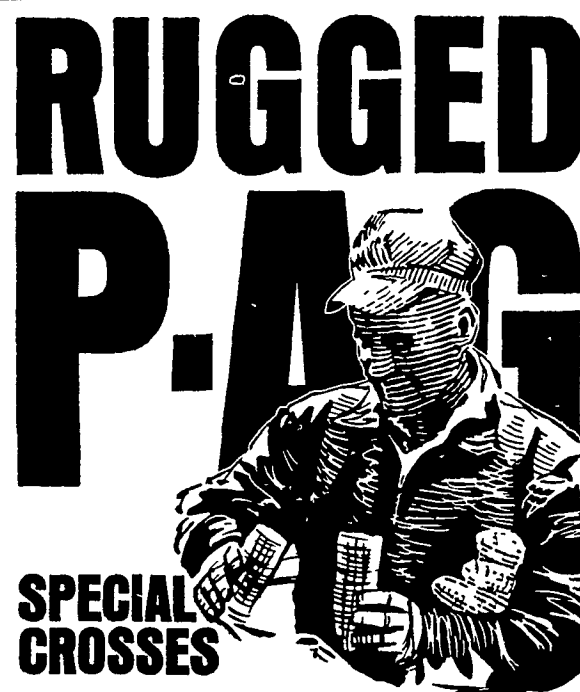
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
