WEEDS ROB

Pigweed, Lambsquarter, Ragweed, Smartweed, and even Crabgrass use more plant food than corn, according to extension agronomists. For example, these weeds contain twice as much nitrogen, 3 ½ times as much potassium, 1 ½ times as much phosphorus, 7 ½ times as much calcium, and over three times as much magnesium as corn.

No wonder weeds account for nearly one-half of all crop losses — \$7.7 billion — due to "pests."
