LIVE HENS

Prices on light hens declined one cent under light trading activity. Movement slackened as some processors observe Hebrew holy day. Conversely, offerings were barely adequate as growers tended to hold flocks due to favorable egg market prices. Demand fair for heavy hens. Offerings were barely adequate with moderate shipments from outside areas noted. Prices paid at farm: Light hens 8-9, mostly 8-8½; Heavy hens 14½-16c.

TURKEYS

Offerings light on toms over 26#, ample on heavy hens & toms. Demand fair. Some processors experiencing difficulty in plant operations due to shortages of help. Prices at

farm: Heavy hens 23-24½, mostly 23c, heavy toms 24# average 22c.

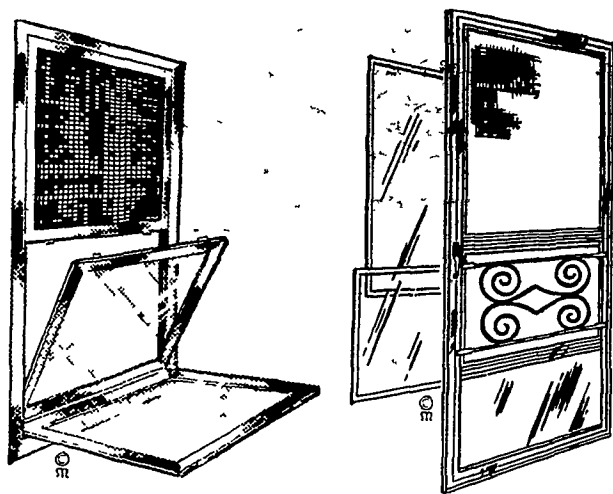

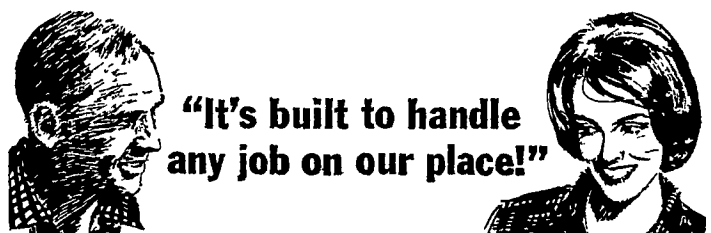
