New Vo-Ag Teacher at Manheim — Mark Campbell has been named to succeed Herbert Hoffritz as teacher of vocational agriculture at Manheim Central High School.

Campbell, a native of Herndon, Pa., was raised on a dairy and poultry farm. He graduated from Penn State University last June with a degree in agricultural education.

Countians To Attend National 4-H Congress — Three 4-H'ers from Lancaster County will be among 42 Pennsylvania young people representing the state at the National 4-H Club Congress at Chicago in November, it was announced this week (September 25).

The three state winners are Dallas Wolgemuth, Mount Joy R1; Nancy Frey, Marietta R1, and Virginia Wivell, Columbia R1.

Wolgemuth and Miss Frey teamed up to win state honors with a livestock conservation demonstration, and Miss Wivell was a state winner in home economics.

Donegal Drops Vo-Ag — The Donegal Union School District recently announced that the vocational agriculture department at Donegal High School has been discontinued.

There now remain nine high schools in the county with active vocational agriculture programs.

County FFA Boys Take 3 Titles At Hershey — Twelve blue ribbons fell to eleven Lancaster County Future Farmers at the FFA Southeast District dairy show at Hershey this week (September 4). Breed titles in Jersey and Brown Swiss competition, a junior Holstein championship, and a second place in county groups, enabled the local boys to give a good account of themselves.

Daryl Bollinger, Cloister Chapter, repeated his last week's 4-H District Show performance by capturing the junior Holstein championship with his senior yearling, Star Segis Osborndale.

Jay Marvin Herr, Solanco Chapter, had the junior champion Jersey with his senior yearling, and went on to take the grand championship for that breed.

In the Brown Swiss division, Dale Forwood of Manheim also showed the junior and grand champion animal.
