

# Solanco Fair

## DAIRY SHOW

In the 38-animal junior dairy show at Wednesday's Solanco Fair, judge John Harris, associate agricultural agent in Dauphin County, twice had to call a halt while contestants fled for shelter from the rain.

But it was fair weather for Twinkle Edgefield Star Sequoia, a four-year-old Holstein cow owned by Richard Rutt of Quarryville R2, as she sailed through the 25-head competition to win the Holstein championship.

Twinkle was also top Holstein at the 4-H county round-up held last month at the Guernsey Sales Pavilion.

Her young owner has been in 4-H work for six years and is presently a junior at Solanco High School. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Amos Rutt.

Reserve Holstein honors went to the second place animal in the three-years and over class shown by Glenn Kreider, Quarryville R1.

Titles in the three other breed classes were won by: Guernsey, champion, Earl Mull, and reserve, by his brother Scott Mull; Jersey, champion and reserve went to animals shown by J Marvin Herr, Holtwood R1; Ayrshire, champion was a nine-year-old cow, the lone Ayrshire entry, shown by Joe Rineer, Strasburg R1.

## STEER SHOW

Thursday afternoon climaxed youth showmanship activities at the Southern Lancaster County Community Fair at Quarryville as sixteen 4-H and nineteen FFA baby beeves were paraded before judge Henry Gruber of the A & B Packing Co., Allentown.

The 4-H animals got the nod for grand champion and reserve honors as Robert Groff's 1050-pound, Old Home Manorbred Angus, and a 1000-pound plus Colorado-bred Hereford shown by Kay Weaver were tapped as number one and two steers in the show, respectively.

Groff, a 1965 graduate of Solanco High School, is the 19-year-old son of Mr and Mrs. Samuel Groff of Peach Bottom R2. This is his sixth year in 4-H baby beef club work, and his second grand championship. He reports he also won the title at the Solanco Fair three years ago with another Angus.

Miss Weaver's win gives the Weaver girls a two-year hold on the reserve title. Last year Kathy Weaver's Angus entry placed second to a Hereford shown by Ken Rutt and owned by Fred Linton, Jr. Both the Weaver girls are daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Jason Weaver of Quarryville R2. Kay is a sophomore at Solanco High School, and is also in her sixth year at showing 4-H steers.

In the FFA division, William Frey of Quarryville R2 showed the top Angus, and went on to win the FFA championship. The Hereford champion, shown by Donald Swinehart, Quarryville R1, was picked by Judge Gruber for reserve champion in the vocational division.

Runnersup in the 4-H contest were Angus, Ronald Enck of Holtwood R1, and, Hereford, Carol Holloway Peach Bottom R2.

Reserve breed winners in the FFA group were Angus, Donald Young, Peach Bottom; and, Hereford, Charles Murphy, also of Peach Bottom.

Reserve grand champion title holder Kay Weaver was also winner of the showmanship

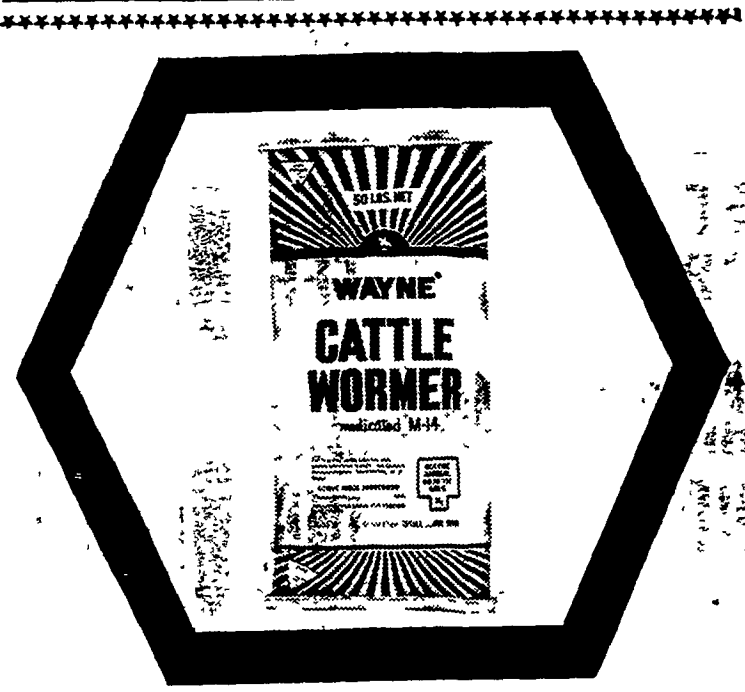

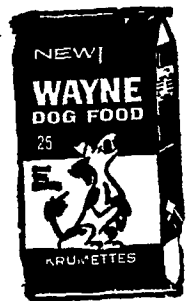

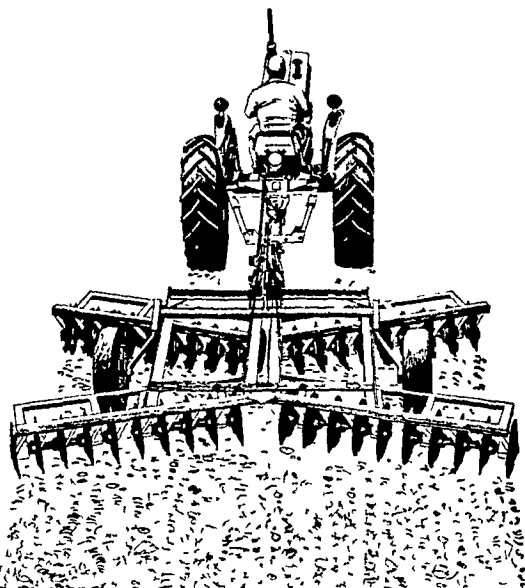
