Nat. 4-H Award To Houser For Demonstration

In conjunction with National 4-H Club Week observance, it was announced Monday that 43 outstanding Pennsylvania 4-H club members were named state winners in the 1966 National Awards program.
 Cited from Lancaster County was Thomas Houser, 16-year-old son of Mr and Mrs Wilbur Houser of Lampeter House, a junior at Lampeter-Strasburg High School, was accorded national recognition for his Livestock Conservation Demonstration, which he presented at Penn State University during 4-H Days in August.

A member of the Garden Spot and Red Rose Baby Beef & Lamb 4-H Clubs Houser has completed projects in beef for five years, sweet corn, gardening, and plan and plant for beauty.

He has served as treasurer in his community club, and news reporter and song leader in the beef and lamb club. Local leaders assisting Houser in his livestock conservation program were Elvin Hess, Jr and Maurice Heir.

Most of the 43 state winners will have an opportunity to attend National 4-H Club Congress in Chicago, November 27-December 1. There, they will compete for numerous national awards and scholarships.

At 1 p.m., Wednesday, October 5, the Fair will feature a Swine Show. This will be followed at 6:30 p.m. by the Baby Beef Show. Last year, the Manheim FFA Chapter introduced a swine sale. It was successful, and this year they will accompany it with a beef cattle sale. All FFA animals shown (hogs and beef cattle) will be consigned to the sale, which will be held at 8 p.m. on Friday.

The Dairy Show will take place at 6:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 6. Tractor driving, at 1 p.m., also on Thursday.
