

State's Hunter Safety Program Nation's Best

The Pennsylvania Game Commission's Hunter Safety Program has been selected as the most outstanding in the nation, the International Association of Game, Fish and Conservation Commissioners announced recently at their annual meeting in Kansas City, Missouri.

Pennsylvania's program, initiated by the Game Commission in cooperation with the National Rifle Association in 1958, has trained 96,053 persons in the safe handling of firearms.

The Game Commission has certified 4,700 Hunter Safety Instructors since the beginning of the program eight years ago. The instructors, representing sportsmen's clubs, schools and civic organizations, receive intensive training, and must demonstrate their proficiency before being certified by District Game Protectors.

Included in the Hunter Safety Course is at least four hours of instruction in arms and ammunition, safe handling of firearms, including bow and arrow, responsibilities of hunters in identifying game, landowner-relations, game laws and Pennsylvania's conservation history.

All students must successfully complete the course of instruction before receiving a certificate from the Game Commission.

The program is entirely voluntary on the part of instructors and students. Hunter Safety Coordinator John C. Behel directs the statewide program.

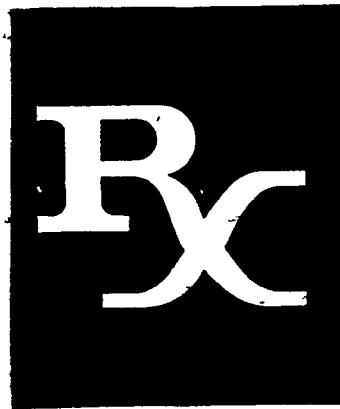
