(Continued from Page 15) ting). Make sure it's firm, but not hard. It should be changing from a deep greenish-gray color to a duller, lighter gray-green. If not ripe yet, it will be a bright green and appear glassy. Flesh is orange-pink with a fine texture. It's spicy in taste.

Honeydew (oval-shaped, smooth, whitish melon). A ripe melon has a creamy yellow outer color, free from greenish cast. The flesh is pale green and it is the sweetest of all melons.

Casaba (nearly round, but somewhat pointed at the stem end; is yellow, with a wrinkled appearance). Look for one that's well yellowed. The flesh is white and very juicy and sweet.

Spanish looks like a small watermelon as it's oblong in shape. Slightly striped with some yellow. The white flesh is similar to honeydew.

When You Buy Children's Clothing

Raglan or kimono sleeves. Deep-cut armholes or set-in sleeves.




