Solanco FFA Champion Steer Brings 70c At Sale; Top Hogs, 40c

As the Solanco Fair closed last Friday night, 21 FFA steers and 20 fat market hogs were put on the block.

The 1080-pound Angus FFA champion exhibited and consigned by William Frey, Quarryville R2, was knocked down to Ferguson and Hassler for 70 cents per pound, or a total of \$756.

The reserve FFA champion, an 1145-pound Hereford owned by Donald Swinehart of Quarryville R1, was bought by the Vintage Sales Co. for 31 cents per pound, or \$354.95.

The steers averaged \$322.02. The champion pen of hogs consigned by Jay Hastings, Kirkwood R1, went to Bow-

man's Food Market for \$40 per hundredweight. The pen of two totaled 435 pounds and brought \$174.

Parke Sollenberger's 460-pound reserve champion pair of Yorkshires went to S. W. Hippey, Willow Street, for \$34 per hundredweight, or \$156.

The ten pens of FFA hogs averaged \$139.29.

Auctioneer for the sale was Kersey Bradley, with Richard B. Lefeve of Quarryville R1 announcing the hog sale, and J. Richards Wood, Solanco High School vo-ag teacher, announcing the steer sale.

Holstein championships at the Ephrata Fair junior dairy show last Friday night went to two members of the Cloister Future Farmers of America Chapter.

A senior yearling, fresh from two earlier junior championships this year, won the 28-entry Holstein breed show for her owner Linford Weaver, Ephrata R1. Weaver, a senior member of the Cloister Chapter, won the championship with Valley Lane Posch Cochran

Finishing in the Holstein breed reserve champion spot was the aged cow, Lady Ivanhoe Posch Cochran, exhibited by David Zimmerman, Reynolds R1. Zimmerman, a 1964 graduate of Ephrata High School, has for the past two years shown "Lady" to the reserve senior and reserve grand champion titles at the Southeast Pennsylvania Regional FFA Dairy Show.

In the Guernsey division, two Lititz R4 youngsters, Cynthia and Jess Balmer, respectively, won the champion and reserve honors.

Named master showman by special classes judge Elvin Hess, Jr of Strasburg R1, was Mary Ellen Kettering of Lititz R3. Her brother, James Kettering, was chosen master fitter. Mary Ellen was also master showman at the 4-H county dairy roundup in August.
