Champion Nets \$715 At N.H. Fair Steer Show

Grand champion steer at the New Holland Fair was sold at auction Thursday at the New Holland Sales Barn. He brought his young owner, Sheryl Weaver of New Holland R1, \$715.

Topping the sale at 65 cents per pound, Blackie was knocked down to Melvin Kolb, Lancaster.

The reserve champion, another Angus, shown by Larry High of Bareville, was bought by Elam Burkholder of Bareville for 37 cents per pound, or \$368.15.

The champion Hereford, shown by Mike Smucker, Ephrata R2, was sold to Zausner Foods, New Holland, at 31 cents per pound for the 1010-pound steer.

The 910-pound reserve Hereford, shown by Larry Schreiner of Bareville, went to Burkholder's Country Store for 315 cents per pound.

Auction of the 24 steers brought an average of 36.27 cents per pound, including the champions, 34.84 cents per pound without the champions.

Steers average weight at the sale was 965 pounds.
