Prices held unchanged on light hens. Overall supplies increased sharply and offerings were adequate to fully ample for a continued good buying interest. Heavy hens were more readily available and ample for a spotty demand that ranged from slow to good. Prices paid @ farms: light hens 7-9, mostly 8-8½; heavy hens 15-16, mostly 15.

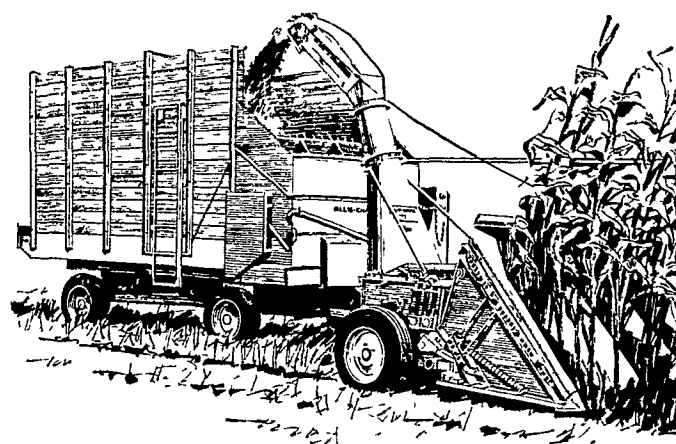
