Farm Show Building here. "We may have lost the battle but we will not lose the war," Olson told the group. "Eventually the (reduced) freight rate will become the order of the day. We only hope that there will be a viable agricultural commodity left in the Northeast to benefit from the adjustment"

Olson stated that even the objectors to the revised rate "do not feel they can stymie these mileage rates forever, but instead feel they are 'buying time'." He noted that the New York Central System loses some \$3,000,000 annually on the handling of grain and grain products, and shares the economic concern of Northeastern producers in obtaining a more realistic, lower rate for handling these products.

"It is the consumer, the northeastern poultry producer and the eastern railroads who really feel the burden of the . . . legal objections to block the rates which would have been effective October 1," he said. The ICC postponed the hearing on the matter of such a rate adjustment indefinitely last week for "further study" of the railroads' rate structure.

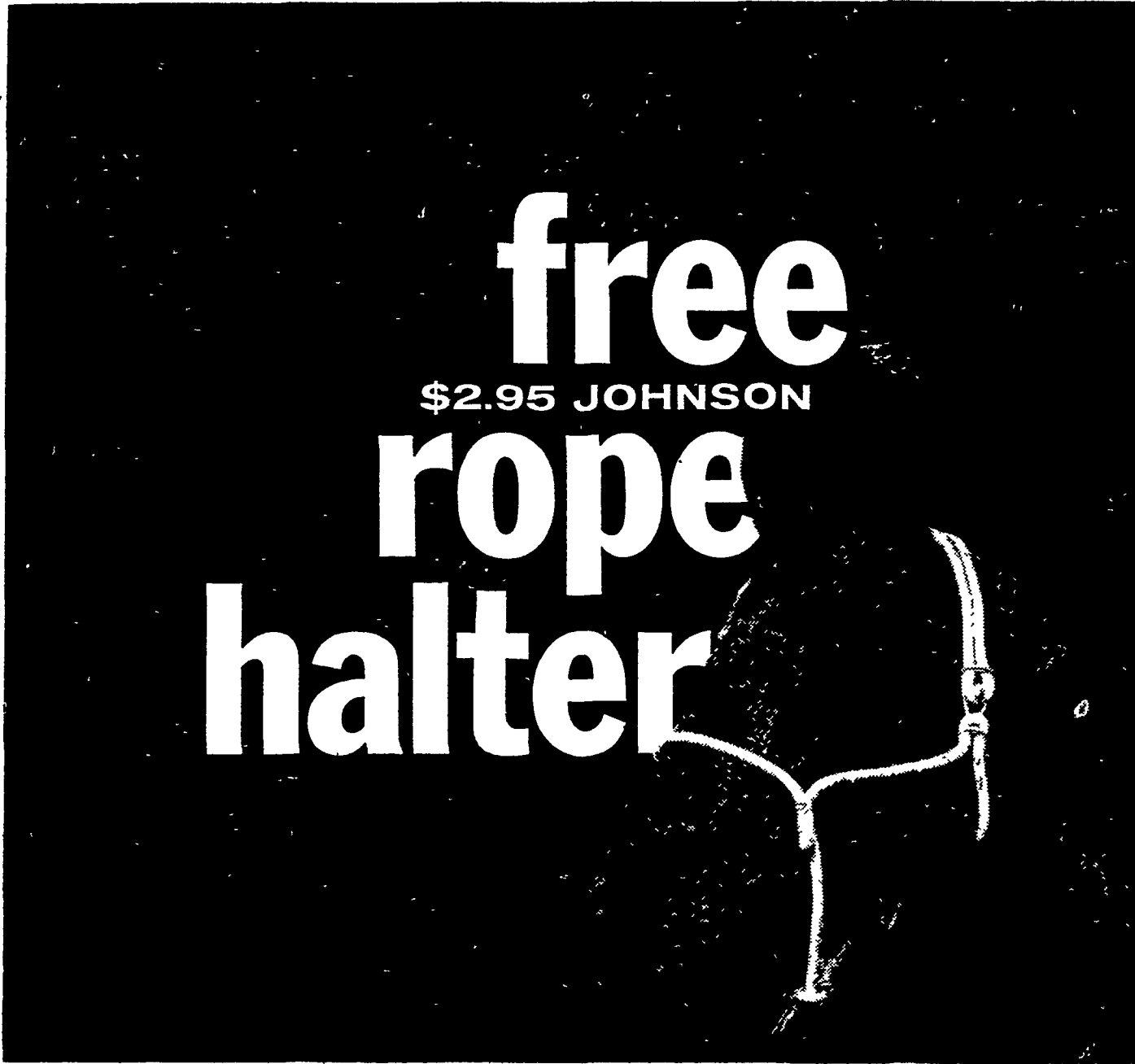

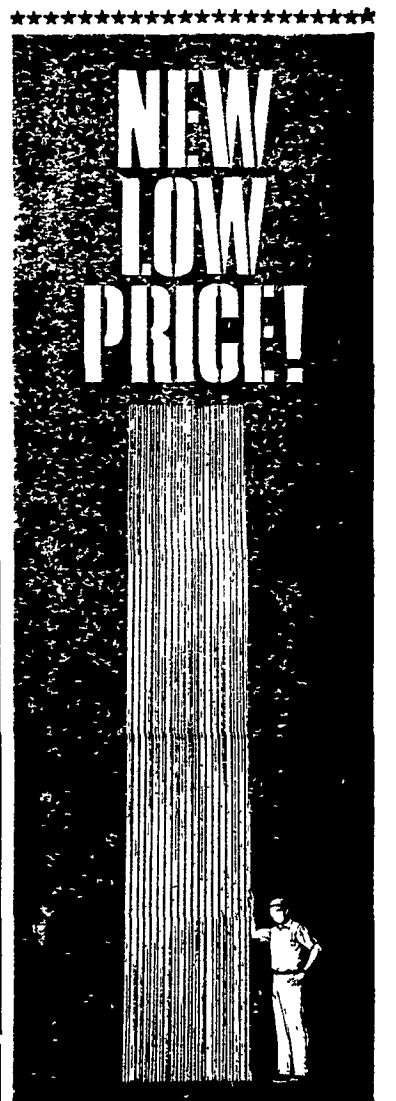
