This year, the price at which foundation herds of livestock, including producing dairy cattle, will amount to 90 percent of the sum of the county loan rate and - for corn - 19 cents per bushel to 1966 feedgrain program cooperators. For barley, the price to farmers will be 90 percent of the sum of the county loan rate and 13 cents a bushel. It will be 90 percent of the sum of the grain sorghum loan rate and 34 cents per hundredweight.

For other eligible livestock. feed grain prices will be based on 115 percent of the sum of the local loan rate and these additional rates for corn, bar ley and grain sorghum.

Under the livestock feed program this year, participators may obtain feed grains on the basis of a minimum of 5 pounds per animal unit per day for eligible livestock.


