CATTLE — Receipts 21,100 compared with 17,000 last week and 22,600 last year. Twelve market receipts 184,200, compared with 175,600 last week and 207,000 last year. Compared with last Friday, slaughter steers were mostly steady, except Choice over 1400 lbs. steady to 25 lower. Slaughter heifers sold mostly 25 lower. Cows were steady to 25 lower and bulls were unchanged. In the carlot dressed meat trade, steer beef sold steady to 50 lower, heifer beef decline 25-50 and cow beef was steady to 50 lower.
