

Champion Cow At Green Dragon Show Nets \$900

Top cow at the annual dairy cow show and sale at Green Dragon Livestock Sales last Friday was sold to Herb Mowery, Oxford R1, for \$900.

The 4-year-old Holstein, Wind hill Winterthur Violet, was sired by Winterthur Ivanhoe Eden Pete, and was out of Windhill Pabst Bula. In her last 305-day lactation she had 15,435 lbs. of milk and 522 lbs. of butterfat. She was shown by Calvin Bowser, Worthington, and Sam Kennedy, Mars, Pa.

First place in the Guernsey and mixed breed divisions went to cows shown by Al Albright, Landisburg, Pa.

A local entry by Fritz Bros, Lancaster, was second place Guernsey; she was sold to Charles Myers, Lancaster, who also bought the third and fourth-place mixed breed entries.

Other local buyers included Isaac Wenger, Leola R1; J. C. Nolt, Leola R1, Melvin Kolb, Lancaster; and Paul Weaver, Ephrata R2.

Judges were Marvin Eshleman, Strasburg; Melvin Kolb; and Fred Naugle, Carlisle.

State's First Tree Farm Rededicated

GETTYSBURG—Nearly 300 people recently witnessed the rededication of the state's first Tree Farm during the Pennsylvania observance of the Silver Anniversary of the

American Tree Farm System. Owned by The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company, the Tree Farm consists of 1763 acres of well-managed forest land and is located five miles west of Fairfield in Adams County.

Maurice K. Goddard, Secretary, Pennsylvania Department of Forests and Waters, stated that 19 years have elapsed since this Tree Farm was formally dedicated. "Since then a multitude of other Pennsylvanians have followed the leadership of the Glatfelters and have added their support to this forward looking venture."

Official rededication of the Tree Farm in the American Tree Farm System was a highlight of the dedication. Frederick T. Murray, Chairman, Pennsylvania Forest Industries Committee, made the presentation to The Glatfelter Pulp Wood Company. P. H. Glatfelter accepted the certificate for his company.

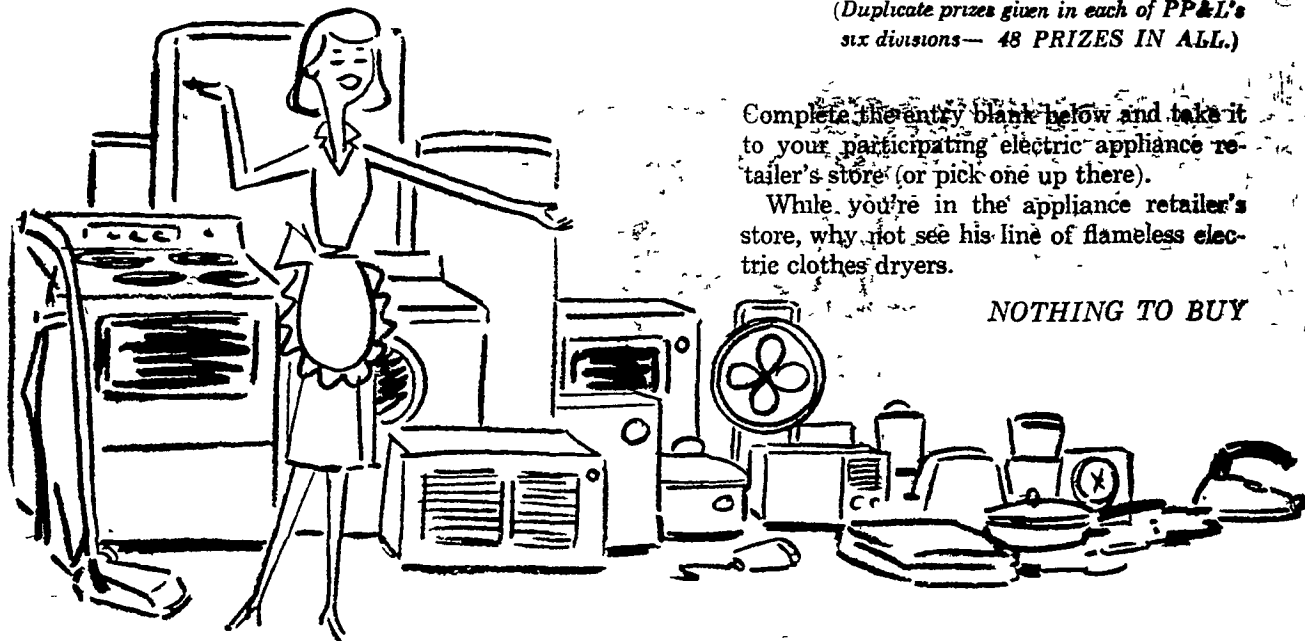

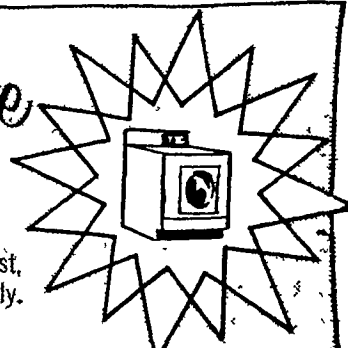
