Hereford, 48 Junior beef breeders will have 12 head. Steers, totaling 372, will include 147 entered by 4-H and FFA youths; open class, 107; feeder calves, 90, and carcass class, 28.

Berkshires top breeding swine with 101 head; Durocs, 99; Poland Chinas, 81; Yorkshires, 80; Chester Whites, 65; Hampshires, 50; Spotted Poland Chinas, 39. Market barrows total 335, and carcass barrows, 104.

Cheviots lead breeding sheep entries with a total of 173 head. Other breed totals: Hampshires, 120; Dorsets, 115; Shropshires, 95; Suffolks, 93; Southdown, 80; Corriedale, 62; Oxford, 51; Columbia, 48; Rambouillet, 45; Merino, 22.

Sheep department entries will include 213 market lambs and 75 carcass wethers.

Horse department entries include 114 Arabians and 84 Apaloosas in addition to the Quarter horses.

The exposition will be held in the State Farm Show Building under the joint auspices of the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture, its Farm Show Commission and the Pennsylvania Livestock and Allied Industries Association.

Cash premiums will total nearly \$50,000. Admission and parking will be free.
