### LIVE HENS

Prices held unchanged, but trended as much as 1c lower within the range. Offerings fully adequate. Demand good, but spotty in nature. A wait and see attitude prevails on heavy hens with no trading reported. Demand light. Supplies fully adequate. Prices paid at farm: Light Hens 7-9, mostly 8-8½; Heavy hens, too few to report.

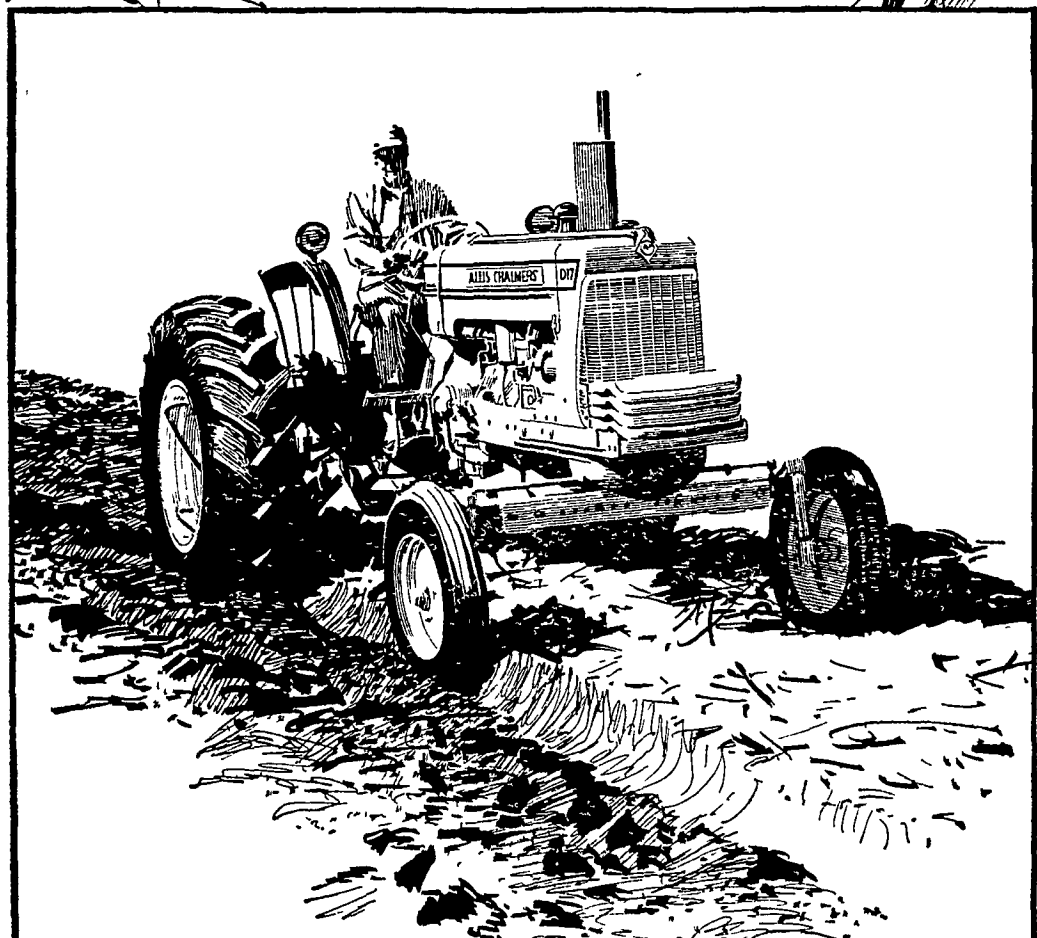
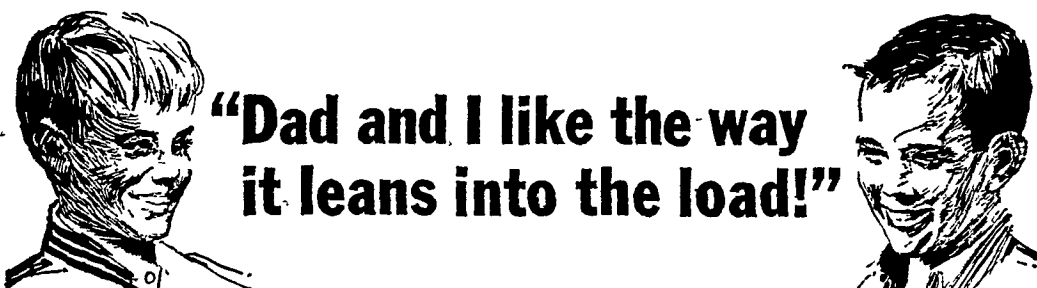

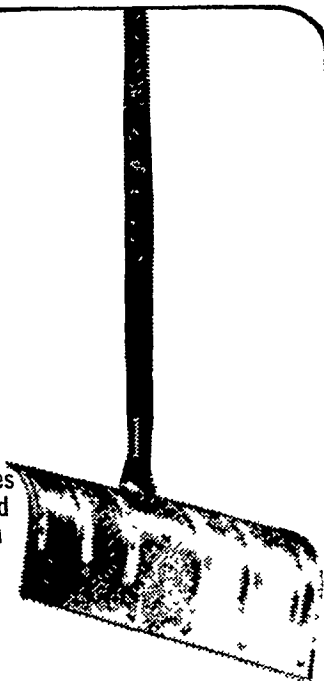
