The weekly lot-average broiler and fryer price gained about 1/10 cent over last

week's average to a level of 13.45 cents per lb., and reflected a daily gain in lot-average prices from Monday through Thursday.

Prices paid ranged from a low of 12.6 cents on Monday to 14.0 cents on Thursday.

Sales for the week were unchanged at 12 million head.

Ready-to-cook demand very good on both advance and fill-in orders. Most plants are booked to capacity for next week.

Estimated slaughter for Friday and Saturday, 955,000 head, compared to 893,000 head last weekend.

Plow Under Residues

Crop residues and weeds plowed under usually add some organic matter. Plowing under also helps kill insects and diseases especially if the ground freezes to plow depth or deeper, reminds J. O. Dutt, extension vegetable crops specialist at Penn State University. Rotation of crops also helps to keep down both insects and diseases on next year's crop.

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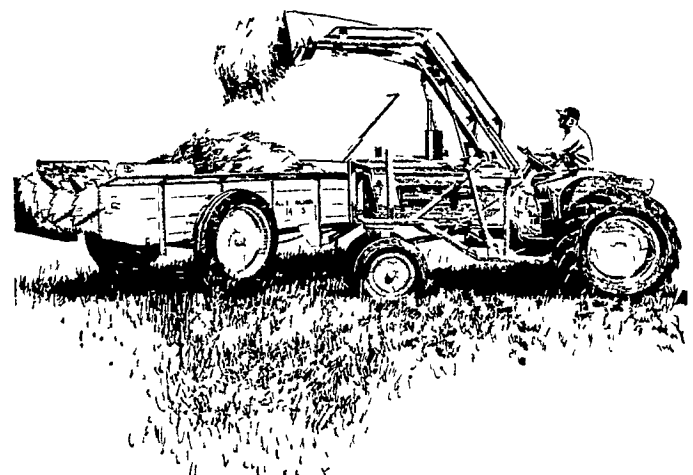


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
