## Price Reporting Changes On Extra Large Eggs Noted By Urner-Barry

NEW YORK — A quotation for Extra Large white eggs will be inaugurated by Urner-Barry Publications on Monday, Nov. 14, the price reporting firm announced here.

In a statement issued last Friday, Urner-Barry listed 5 reasons favoring the move and 3 in opposition. The firm also noted that in an effort to avoid confusion, some changes in grade terminology will be made in its price table.

These changes include changing the name of Extra Fancy Heavyweights to Large Fancy, while Fancy Heavyweights would be changed to No 1 Large, with the same specifications as the former names required.

The reasons given for favoring an Extra Large quotation are:

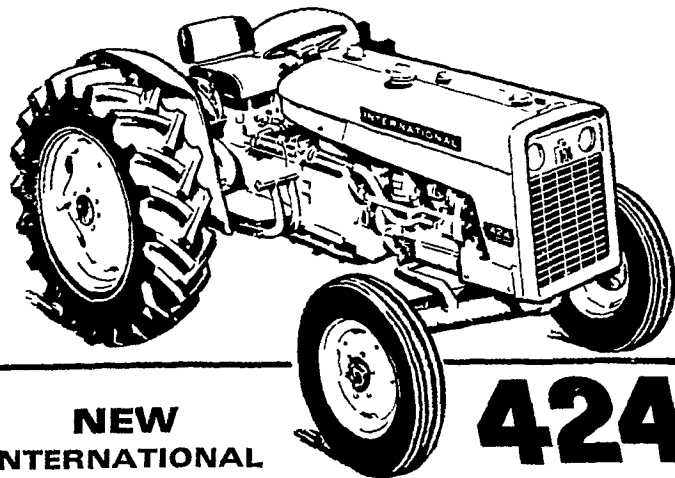
