Farm Prices In Pa. Up 7%; Off 1½% In U.S.

Prices received by Pennsylvania farmers for their products in October edged up slightly from a month earlier, contrary to a 15 percent decline for the entire nation according to the State Crop Reporting Service.

Compared to a year earlier, average prices received by Pennsylvania farmers were up 10 percent while the national average was 7 percent above that of mid-October 1965.

The average price paid by U.S. farmers for commodities and services in October was unchanged from a month earlier, but 5 percent higher than last year.

The Pennsylvania price average was strengthened by advances in milk, feed grains, hay and vegetables.

The price received for milk was up 15 cents a hundred weight from a month earlier — approximately three tenths of a cent a quart. The mid-October price of \$5.80 per cwt was equivalent to approximately 12½ cents a quart.

Slight advances were recorded in the prices of oats, barley, rye and hay, while potatoes were up 16 cents per cwt over mid-September quotations.

Most prices received for livestock declined slightly with hogs off 80 cents per cwt from a month earlier.

PP&L Offers 23 Scholarships To Area Schools

Pennsylvania Power & Light Company President Jack K. Busby announced this week that PP&L is offering 23 scholarships to high school seniors graduating in the spring of 1967. The scholarships are available at 21 colleges and universities in Central Eastern Pennsylvania to students whose parents reside in the company's service area.

"The rapid technological advancements in this country," Busby said, "are continually increasing the demand for larger numbers of better trained leaders. It is these people who provide the leadership so vital in developing an ever-improving society. As opportunities have expanded in recent years, the cost of obtaining a college education has increased, making it a prohibitive factor for a growing number of potential students. PP&L offers these students an opportunity to compete for scholarships under its program of aid to higher education."

Each of the 21 colleges and universities is responsible for selecting from among all the applicants the recipient of a PP&L scholarship. Therefore, an applicant is eligible to compete for scholarships only at those institutions participating in the PP&L program to which he or she has been admitted. Of course, a high school senior may apply to more than one service area college for a PP&L scholarship, Busby said.

Since the program's inception in 1947, PP&L has assisted 227 young people in their search for a higher education. The company's aid to education in the last year exceeded \$160,000, including scholarship assistance, contributions to independent colleges and college expansion activities, and matching employee contributions to alumni funds and foundations, according to Busby.
