Prices received by Pennsyl vania farmers for their prod te's in October edgel up g'igh'ly from a month carlier centiary to a 15 percent de cline for the entire nation w cording to the State Crep Repor ing Service

Compa ed to a year cuber average prices received by Pennsylvania farmers were up 10 percent while the national average was 7 percent above that of mil October 1965

The ave s price pad by US fumers for commonly's and services in Octobe visurchanged from a month on lier, but 5 percent higher
