

Parents Of FFA State Officers To Be Honored

HARRISBURG — State officers of the Future Farmers of America will honor their parents during the mid-winter FFA State meeting held in connection with the 1967 State Farm Show.

In ceremonies in the Forum of the Education Building during the vocational agriculture boys' convention Wednesday, January 11, the six FFA State officers and five regional vice presidents will confer the "Honorary Keystone Farmer" degree upon their fathers and will present to their mothers hand-engrossed certificates as a token of appreciation for the encouragement, cooperation and assistance given her son, which contributed to his outstanding achievements in the Future Farmers of America.

honors are Mr. and Mrs. Andrew G. Weber, Mohnton R2, whose son, Glenn, is FFA State president; Mr. and Mrs. Clayton E. Fogle, Lewisburg R1, whose son, Harold, is State secretary; Mr. and Mrs. Ellsworth H. Parsons, Blais Mills R1, parents of Barry E. Parsons, State treasurer; Mr. and Mrs. William A. Trout, Newport R1, whose son, Roy, is State reporter; Mr. and Mrs. J. Richard Hackenberg, Lewisburg R2, parents of David Hackenberg, State sentinel; and Mr. and Mrs. George R. Manbeck, Womelsdorf R1, whose son, Oscar, is State chaplain.

Recognition of the parents' cooperation, which enables the boys to be absent from home to fill the many engagements which befall a FFA State officer, first became a feature of the FFA convention at the 1954 State Farm Show and has been granted each year since.

In addition to the officers' fathers, a number of business-

men, farmers, and schoolmen will receive the "Honorary Keystone Farmer" degree at the FFA meeting. The Keystone Farmer degree for FFA boys, earned for exceptional merit in agriculture, scholarship and leadership, also will be conferred upon more than 200 members of the Future Farmers during the convention.

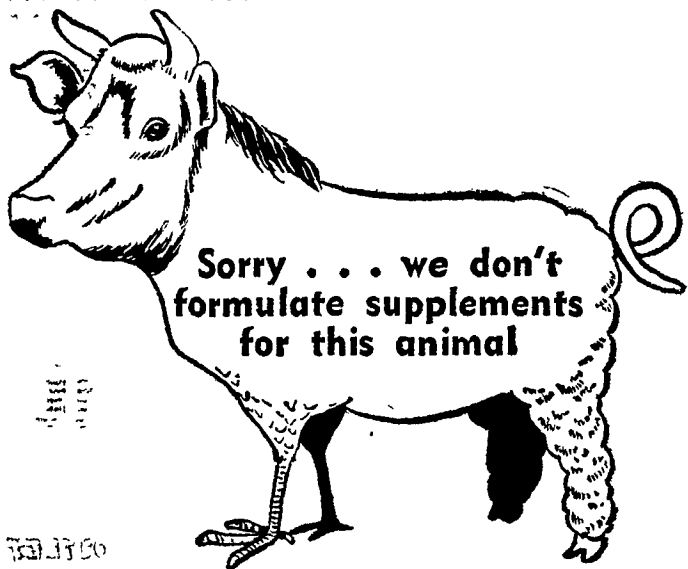
