As you enter the cow stable a sign overhead, "Welcome To Groffdale," prepares you for the tall, flat-rumped and well-uddered cattle housed here. Especially pleasing are the daughters of Bob's herd sire, Jewelholm Reflection Sovereign

(VG). The sharp dairyness along with picture-type udders make these homebred products easily identifiable in the milking barn. The average classification on the herd sire's daughters is 82 points with Groffdale Reflection Delight, Excellent at 91 points, as top. Delight has freshened four times in four years in the same month. Her four-year-old record is 336d 18,500m 685f. The latest total herd classification results show one Excellent, 12 Very Good, and 12 Good Plus for a 102.3 BAA score. Other top production records of the herd sire's daughters include Groffdale Reflec-

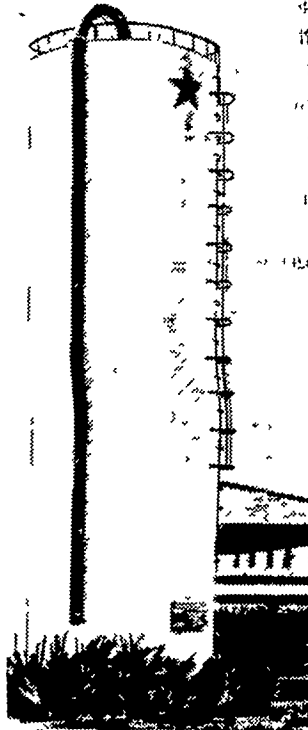
tion Diane, 4y 365d 22,534m 4.2% 996f; Groffdale Reflection Lulu, 4y 365d 20,438m 4.0% 813f and Groffdale Reflection Dee, 5y 303d 17,279m 4.1% 711f. Thirty-one records of these daughters average 15,540 pounds of milk and 568 pounds of butterfat. Another great cow is Groffdale Lucifer Lorraine (VG), the dam of the 19,000-pound, Very Good, 86 point, two-year-old that Bob sold in the November Pennsylvania Holstein Association State Sale held in Harrisburg. Lorraine's six-year-old record is 365d 23,253m 4.2% 977f.

Robert is currently president of the Lancaster County Holstein Association and has served as vice president and president of the Lancaster County Extension Association. He is a 4-H leader of the county Holstein club and serves on the property and finance committee for the Mechanics Grove Church of the Brethren.
