Close behind the Hees steer was a high weight Shorthorn exhibited by Kendace Bony of Mount Joy R2 "Smoky Nose", as Miss Bony calls him, was the biced champion at the Manheim Fair Show last fall, but had to settle for reserve breed championship here Thursday. Miss Bony, the 14-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. H. Kenneth Bony, is a freshman at Donnal High School.

Early in the show, the County's chances looked fairly good. We had the Shorthorn breed wrapped up with a double win, and Mike Hosler's light-heavyweight entry took the reserve title in the Hereford division. That gave countians three of the first four titles going into the Angus show. Another apparent break—added to the fact that traditional winner Richard Rishel wasn't entered this year—was that the formidable Davis boys from Bedford County, who teamed up to win last year's event, were placed out of the running in the Hereford judging.

But the Angus competition proved too tough. The highest any Lancaster County youngster scored was Glenn Flickinger's second place heavy-weight Angus.

TRIO TRIMMED

The defending Trio champions from Lancaster County had a strong entry composed of Angus shown by Robert Donough and Gary Neff, both of Mount Joy R2, and Dale Bushong, Columbia R2. But this didn't seem to be the year in this class either. The Adams County entry beat Lancaster out for the title, but our county topped its traditional rivals from Chester, York, and Dauphin counties in that order.

SHOWMANSHIP

Seven youngsters, including four who had previous showmanship wins this year that made them eligible, were pitted in the Sweepstakes Showmanship Contest. The last time Lancaster County won this coveted state title was in 1964 when Larry Weaver of New Holland R1 staged a comeback effort that carried him all the way to the top. Sam Wylie III, Nottingham Chester County, was named champion showman of the 1967 Fair Show. Wylie had earlier been named champion Angus showman. Last year's winner, Earl Denney of Dauphin County placed third this year, one spot behind York countian George Dutrey, Jr. Showmanship judges were Glenn Kean, extension livestock specialist, and R. L. Kimble, director of new Penn State meat evaluation center.

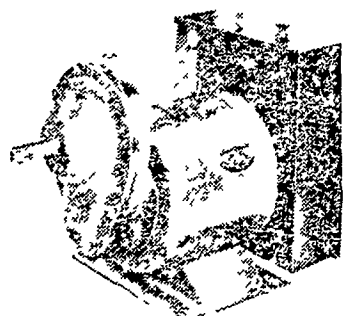
