HARRISBURG — Lancaster County showmen got off to a running start Monday at the Pennsylvania Farm Show with a triple championship performance by Masonic Homes Farm, Elizabethtown, Ayrshire dairy cattle breeders.

The four-year-old Masonic Homes senior champion Francine went on to take the grand champion Ayrshire cow title, and a young bull calf, Masonic Homes Royal Blend, won reserve champion bull honors.

4-H Master Showman awards went to two other Elizabethtown area youngsters, Mary Jane and Sandra Eshleman. This was a repeat performance for Mary Jane, who was one of four master showmen at last year's event.

Judging the 1967 Ayrshire competition was Clifford Cook, a New York sale's agent for dairy cattle.

County Holsteinmen Go Scoreless On Titles At 51st Pa. Farm Show

HARRISBURG — Although the major titles at the Pennsylvania Farm Show's Holstein dairy cattle exhibition Tuesday stayed in southeastern Pennsylvania — Cumberland and Dauphin counties, Lancaster County showmen were held to 15 scattered hits. Two of these, however, were first place efforts by Robert H. Kauffman, Elizabethtown R1, entries which put the county in contention for junior and senior champion titles.

At last year's Farm Show, a Kauffman senior yearling bull, Penn Springs Leader, represented the county's highest placing by winning the grand champion bull title. This year, Lancaster County showmen had no bulls entered, top bull titles went to Howard B Weiss, Lebanon County, and George M Knight, York County.

The grand champion Holstein female for the 1967 show was Conewago Reflection Anna, a three-year-old entry by Warren N and Karl L. Hertzler Anna, a Penn State Marshall Reflection daughter, was also senior champion.

The Hertzler entry was as close as Lancaster County came to hitting a home run. How close can you get? The Hertzler farm borders the Conewago Creek which is the dividing line between Lancaster and Dauphin counties. However, Karl Hertzler told Lancaster Farming later that five acres of the farm is actually in Lancaster County — so, if we can stretch that technicality, perhaps we can claim a moral victory at this year's show!

Reserve senior and reserve grand champion female titles were won by an aged cow, Lockway Elva Lucifer, exhibited by Allen Dairy Farms, Cumberland County.

Cumberland and York entries won the 4-H dairy championships, and Bekks and

Lebanon Future Farmers took the vocational titles.

A break-down of the record number of entries in this year's show — 316 — revealed 243 in open-class competition, 52 in 4-H classes, and 21 vocational agriculture entries.

Judging the all-day exhibition was James M Lewis, a dairy breeder and showman from Hamilton, Ohio.

David Hoover, Penn Manor FFA Chapter, also duplicated his county performance at the state show. His wrapper hand topped the vocational competition in Lancaster last week and again in Harrisburg on Sunday.

Eddie Rohrer, Paradise R1, was runnerup to Robert Weaver of Strasburg R1 in the county filler tobacco class, but the two boys swapped positions in that department when they met again at the state show.

A similar swap was made by two brothers in 4-H competition. James Greider, Columbia R2, placed first in the county show in wrappers, but dropped to fifth here Sunday. A brother, Jeff, moved into the top spot.

In 4-H fillers, Eric Stoner, 1051 Eden Road, took first place in that class from county winner Judy Thomas, Millersville R1.
