PA. APPLES IN STORAGE DROP 44 PERCENT

HARRISBURG — Supplies of apples in cold storages throughout the state totaled 2,720,000 bushels on November 30, down 44 percent from the same date a year ago, according to the Pennsylvania Crop Reporting Service.

Of the total, 1,635,000 bushels are for processing, and 1,085,000 bushels are for fresh markets.

Cold storage apple holdings in the United States totaled 45,101,000 bushels at the end of November, 5,000,000 bushels less than a year earlier.
