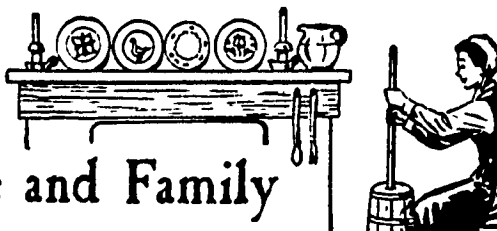

For Better Sewing Results

For top performance from your sewing machine, keep it clean. This means taking out lint and dust regularly.

Keep the machine covered when not in use and you'll cut down on the dust that gets into the working parts. A small brush is a must for removing lint.

At least once a month clean the machine. If you do a lot of sewing, you may need to clean it more often. Before oiling the machine is a good time to use the lint brush — remove the throat plate and clean the bobbin carrier. Use the brush wherever you see lint on machine parts.

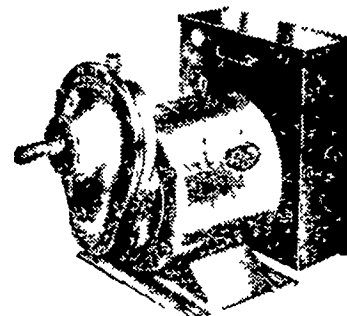

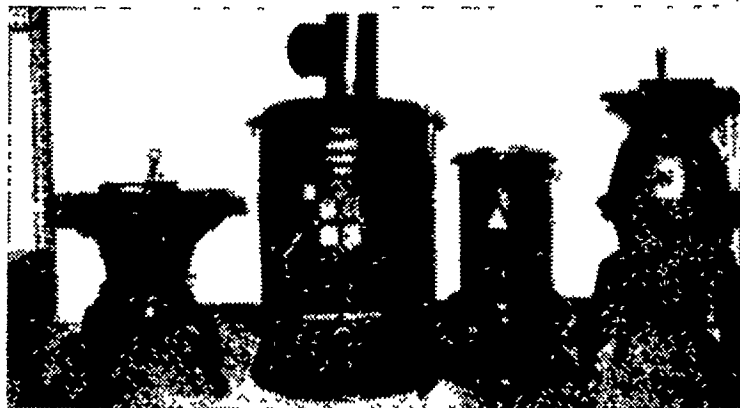

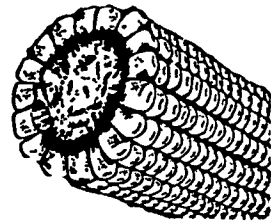
